Our School

Perry High School, the newest high school in the Chandler Unified School District, was established in the fall of 2007. We celebrated our first graduating class in June of 2010. Our Fall 2011 enrollment is 2,287. Perry High is a public, comprehensive four-year high school, which emphasizes a college preparatory curriculum in addition to technology and vocational based programs. All Perry Faculty are highly certified in their content area.

The mission of Perry High School is to provide an enriched environment where our students can develop **Pride** in themselves, their school, and their community; where they can demonstrate **Progress** in their ability to think critically in a technologically advanced society; and where they can realize their **Purpose** as responsible citizens.

Academics – The academic program is organized on a modified block schedule and calendar year. A full course load is six credits. The graduation requirements for the class of 2011 is 22 credits. Students graduating with 24 credits, achieve a weighted grade point average of 3.8 or better, are members of National Honor Society, and have completed 6 or more honors or AP courses including at least one in their senior schedule, graduate with the recognition of Distinguished Scholar. Perry will introduce their Stem Scholar Program in the 2012-2013 school year.

Grading Scale

All courses (grades 9th –12th) are included in the cumulative GPA. Class Ranks are based on the weighted cumulative GPA. AP and Honors classes are weighted by one point. Grades are recorded on the transcript and grade point average is computed in January and June.

Advance Placement: Courses are offered in English 11, English 12, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Spanish 4, Spanish 5, French 4, French 5, German 4, German 5, Psychology, American Arizona History, Human Geography, United States/Arizona Government & Constitution, and Macroeconomics.

Honors classes are offered in English 9, English 10, Math Year 2, Math Year 3, Pre Calculus, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, French 3, German 3, Spanish 3, and World History & Geography.

Dual Enrollment enables students to enroll in freshmen college courses and earn college credits at local institutions of higher education. Course offerings at Perry include English, Creative Writing, Math, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Spanish, French, German, Sign Language, Early Childhood Education, Education Profession and Government and selected CTE classes.

Advance Placement Results:

In May 2011, 280 students took AP exams. A total of 481 exams were taken in 15 subjects 60% of the AP Exams testers received scores of 3 or higher.

Class of 2011 Post High School Placement:

46% matriculated to 4-year college or university
41% matriculated to a 2-year community college
7% selected work, military service, or technical instruction
