

<u>Kitty Hawk Air Society Formal</u> <u>Initiation Process</u>

- "KHAS shall promote higher academic standards, be of service to the school and community, promote self-confidence, and initiative, develop leadership ability, encourage academic excellence, and further educational development in post high school years."
- Kitty Hawk Air Society recognizes exceptional cadets who supersede academic standards, show substantial responsibility, and display leadership potential. The initiation process displays the cadet's endurance as well as dedication and effort put forth by a cadet.

In the formal initiation process:

- 1. Cadets must complete the team building activity by creating and painting a shield, reciting the KHAS preamble, and mastering Air Force general knowledge.
- 2. Cadets must also plan and complete a community service event, in which all potential KHAS candidates must participate in
- 3. And last but not least, attend the KHAS formal initiation banquet where cadets will be presented a KHAS cord and a pin.
- Cadets who have successfully completed the formal initiation process will become a member of KHAS and participate in our regular Tuesday meetings @ lunch to assist in tutoring and mentoring cadets who are struggling in their classes.
- This packet includes a signature sheet to attach to the back of the shield, instructions on creating the shield, a set of instructions for planning a community service event, and a final verification sheet that must be signed by the SASI or ASI and the KHAS commander upon completion.

*Cadets must receive the KHAS commander's signature only after obtaining existing members signatures Once cadets complete their shield, cadets will be responsible for answering questions about Air Force general knowledge as well as being responsible for reciting the KHAS preamble (**verbatim**).

- Cadets will then formally answer the question with this statement:

- The KHAS member will then, and only then, give the cadet the signature if the cadet recites the answer to the designated question **verbatim**. Integrity is key in this activity, if there is a discrepancy in your paperwork, disciplinary actions will be made.
- After answering all questions and obtaining all signatures cadets will move onto the next step.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

Once cadets complete prior steps, all cadets will part in actively planning as well as participating in their community service event.

- 1. Cadets will brainstorm/choose and organize a community service event.
- 2. Once planning is finalized and agreed upon among all cadets, cadets will then formally present their project to the KHAS Commander as well as the SASI/ASI
- 3. Once approved by both the KHAS Commander and the SASI/ASI, cadets will plan out a day & time in which all cadets will participate in the event. (ALL CADETS MUST PARTICIPATE AS PREVIOUSLY STATED)
- 4. Upon completion, cadets will obtain a signature from the KHAS Commander and SASI/ASI verifying that the cadet has successfully completed the initiation process.
