



	vegetables are the exception, unless it becomes a distraction to other students.

	offensive remarks regarding gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, intelligence, or		
	physical appearance. Although participation is highly encouraged in a language class,		
	conversation is limited to the topic at hand.		

# Cellphone & Headphones Policy

All assignments are to be completed individually and to the best of the student's ability. If any assignment is questionable, the student will receive a "0" on the assignment and referred to a VP.

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Homework Policy
