Course Description

This course will cover the history of the United States from the first settlers to present day. We will examine key events and study how these events helped mold the nation as we know it today.

Grading:

Grading of student's performance is based on a point system, and points earned from the total points will be converted into a percentage corresponding to the following grade:

- 90-100% = A
- 80-89% = B
- 70-79% = C
- 60-69% = D
- Below 60% = Failing

Grades will be based on the following scale:

- Tests/Quiz's
- Homework/Classwork
- Current Events

Quality of Work

- Always answer in complete sentences
- Work to be turned in should not have doodling, and not torn or wrinkled
- All work turned in must include a title or heading with name, date and period

Homework

- Homework assignments are due the following day unless otherwise noted
- Students will have the opportunity to correct homework for full credit.
- **Late Work:** Will be accepted, but will receive half credit.

Make-up Assignments and Exams

- **Make-up work is the responsibility of the student and not of the teacher.** Absent students are responsible for checking with the teacher and picking up missed work. Missed work will be due the day after the student returns, unless the absence is for multiple days.
- Class work for extra credit **CANNOT** be made-up.
