### FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

Just a few reminders, all students entering 7th grade next school year must have had a 6th grade physical with the appropriate immunizations. If you have a child in 6th grade who received a physical packet from the nurse's office they have not met this State of Connecticut mandate and need to do so to enter 7th grade. If you have a child in 5th grade this year they can meet this physical requirement if they hand in a physical dated from January of this year, 2014. A physical from the year, 2013 does not meet this requirement for 5th grade students. Any questions please call the nurse's office. If your child was sent home a vision referral form, please return it the nurse's office. The back of the form needs to be completed by the eye doctor and returned to the nurse's office. If you have a child in pre-k entering kindergarten next year and they have a physical done this year, 2014, please send a copy in to the nurse's office. This will meet the mandatory physical requirement for kindergarten for next year.

# Whats happening around the school????

<u>Kindergarten</u> We are continuing to blend sounds together to make words and continuing to read and write our own sentences using our High Frequency Words and decodable words. We are also introducing words with long vowel sounds. In math we are working hard on subtraction and starting to talk about different strategies we can use to subtract. Please continue all your hard work at home practicing these letters, sounds and high frequency words. As always, any donations of tissues and hand sanitizer are always appreciated. Thank you parents for all of your continued hard work, we couldn't do it without you!

1st Grade We hope everyone had a restful and fun spring break! First grade continues to be very busy as the end of the year approaches. We are learning about author's message and themes in Reading. In Math we are focusing on place value, shapes, and addition and subtraction within 20. Please continue to practice reading, star words, and math facts at home every night. Also, remember to send in those box tops!! Thanks!

<u>2<sup>nd</sup> Grade</u> Our last unit in reading is poetry. Students will be asked to write an acrostic, cinquain, limerick, sensory and haiku poem. Not only will they be asked to write these poems but will have to read them fluently and with expression. We are looking forward to an exciting final unit!

Marshmallows, monkeys, moms and more, Poetry helps us to explore. Words that paint pictures spoken aloud, Which brings us to plays we perform for a crowd. We'll improve our fluency and build self-esteem. We're poets and players: We work as a team.

It's the third grade working hard on their poetry!
Our poems have idioms, metaphors, and similes
Sometimes we even use hyperboles!
When your children are bored at home,
encourage them to write a creative poem!

We are not done with  ${\bf multiplication}$  and  ${\bf division}$  just yet!

So....keep using those basic fact flashcards and watch your children become math SUPER STARS!

4th Grade 4th Grade has embarked on a new journey for the final marking period. We will be reading and studying different folktales through various cultures. We will be discussing characters in depth as well as making comparisons to the different stories from different cultures. If you have a favorite that perhaps your family has passed on or talked about, please feel free to share it with us. We would love to learn more about our students' culture and the other students would benefit from it as well! In math we have entered the angle phase. The students are all learning how to use protractors to measure angles. We are also using various shapes and designs to determine angle degrees and to identify the angle itself. They are really having fun with this! As always, don't forget to have them review their basic facts in all areas nightly!

5th Grade Students in fifth grade are beginning their fourth unit of study in Language Arts. In this unit, <u>Is It Real?</u>, the students will study non-fiction and historical fiction. They will learn about different time-periods including the Revolutionary War, the Civil War, the Depression, and the Holocaust. They will discuss cause and effect relationships during these time periods. Social Studies will be closely tied to the Language Arts unit, in order to give students the necessary background knowledge for the different time periods. Students will also continue to work on doing research and writing argumentative essays. In math, students will study the coordinate plane and ordered pairs. Students will begin to analyze and study algebraic functions. Grade 5 student will begin the Smarter Balanced Assessment on Friday May 2, and will continue through the month of May. Please make sure your child attends school every day and arrives at school on time.

6<sup>th</sup> Grade Grade 6 students are looking forward to their field trip to Kennedy High School on May 7th for the Power of One presentation on self-esteem and student leadership. We are excited to announce that we have submitted our poems to the Silas Bronson Library for the annual Poetry Contest. Good Luck to all our participants! Algebraic concepts and word problems are the focus for our math unit. While in Science we are focused on Weather Patterns and Storms, we are very pleased that spring has finally sprung!

7th Grade In ELA we are about to jump into our final unit. I cannot believe the year has gone so fast! I am particularly excited about this unit as it is titled "You are the Author!" and will be focused on Creative Writing and Literary Analysis. We have so many creative minds in class that I cannot wait to see what the students produce. Thank you to all of you who came in for Parent/Teacher Conferences. In math, students are currently working on module 6 - Inferences about Populations. In this unit students will use mean, median, and mode, and range to make comparative inferences about populations. Students will create/interpret stem and leaf plots, histograms, line plots, and frequency charts to make generalizations about populations.

Essential Skills In the Essential Skills class, we have been working on the following letters: N, J, G and R and high frequency words: by, for, had and have. We have also been working on the number nine and ordinal position of pictures or objects. We have continued our study of Connecticut and have also begun our unit on Spring.

Bilingual/ELL/ESL During the month on April all EL (English Learners) students worked hard taking the LAS Links Test (Language Assessment Scale). Now that we are all done, we'll celebrate the completion of this tremendous task with an "Ice Cream Party" on Thursday, May 1. Congratulations to all EL students for their great effort!

<u>Health and Physical Education</u> Students will learn the proper way to bowl using the four step approach and grades 5-7 will learn how to score a game by hand. Field day is coming up fast and we will need volunteers for the various stations. Volunteer forms will be sent home in the beginning of the month.

<u>Art</u> As spring is actually here, the Pre-K and Kindergarten students will be creating artwork to correspond to the letters "G", "E" and "D" which is part of "Growing like Me" for the month of May. First grade will be creating and painting clay pinch pots. Second grade will be continuing to illustrate the covers for their animal rhyming book to correspond with their music class. Third, 4th and  $5^{th}$  grades will also be creating and painting clay pinch pot animals, fish or monsters. The  $6^{th}$  grades will illustrate the world flags to correspond to the spring concert in May while the  $7^{th}$  grade will be working on a graffiti project that corresponds to their music class. Hope everyone enjoys this warmer weather.

<u>Music</u> The Reed School Spring Concert is right around the corner! There will be two performances of the concert on Thursday, May 8<sup>th</sup>. The morning performance will be from 9:15-10:00 and the afternoon performance is from 1:30-2:15. The theme of the concert is Around the World, so prepare to hear music from America, Bolivia, Japan, and more!

<u>Social Studies</u> In Social Studies, students will be learning about Manifest Destiny, The Mexican War, and how and when more states were added. Students will also be learning about the differences that caused the division between the North and the South that would eventually lead to the Civil War. As the school year winds down, students will continue to work on using primary and secondary sources to support their writing.

<u>Science</u> In science this past month students have been working on plate boundaries and understanding land formations. Students performed an experiment to create a structure to withstand an earthquake. Two students had to work together to build a structure and then have it tested to see if it could survive the devastation of P waves and S waves from earthquakes. Many students had been successful in building the structure.

<u>Library</u> The month of April found us working on research skills, poetry and ending up with our fabulous bookfair! May will bring end of year projects and reading for PLEASURE!!!!

<u>Reading</u> "Today a reader, tomorrow a leader." — Margaret Fuller Keep reading and growing this spring!



We have been working with our intervention groups to teach students strategies to become skillful readers. Good readers have learned the cognitive skills that increase reading comprehension. First, they identify the purpose for reading the story or passage. Second, they recognize instances when the story becomes unclear and take appropriate steps for clarification. In addition, proficient readers activate prior knowledge before, during, and after reading the text; identify the main idea or theme; ask questions internally and externally; create sensory images; draw inferences; retell and synthesize; and seek to rectify conceptual misconceptions (Keene and Zimmermann 1997). Please continue to support your child's progress in becoming a skillful reader by having him/her read nightly and discuss the text.

<u>Family and Consumer Sciences</u> 6th Grade is going to be starting their final unit of the school year on Sewing. They will be learning how to thread the needle, sew on a button, and will be making their own pillows. 7th Grade is finishing up their Money Management unit. They are proving to be excellent check writers and are going to wrap up the unit with learning how to use a checkbook register and how to balance it correctly.
