Reminders

From the Nurse's Office



Please keep your child home if:

- They have a temperature of 100.4 or higher. They can return if they are fever-free for 24 hours without a fever reducing medication such as Tylenol or Motrin.
- They have vomited within the past 24 hours. They can return if they are free from vomiting for at least 2 solid meals.
- They have had diarrhea within the past 24 hours. They can return if they are free from diarrhea for at least 24 hours.
- They have a body rash with itching or fever. They can return if they have been evaluated by a doctor and are fever-free.
- Eye infection, redness, itching and/or crusty drainage from eye. They can return once they are evaluated, treated, and have a note to return to school.
- If they have been exposed to or are suspected of having Covid-19. They can return after being tested, evaluated by a doctor, and have a doctor's note to return to school.
- Uncontrollable cough, shortness of breath, wheezing, or any symptoms related to an asthma flare-up. They can return if they have been treated and evaluated by a doctor and have an asthma action plan provided to the school, along with any rescue medication that is required.


