

In math, we will continue working on counting and writing numbers 1-10. We will also begin comparing numbers using the words "more than" and "less than". Welcome to first grade! We are so excited to begin the school year! This month we will be overcoming and persevering through the obstacles of sychronus and asychronus learning! We will learn to be kind, patient and hardworking students!

Our math goal is to become fluent in addition and subtraction within 10. Our reading goal in first grade is to become fluent readers.

This month in Math, students will learn that counting relates to addition and subtraction, the strategy to count on to add and addition with doubles and doubles +1. During Fundations and Wonders, students will learn letter sounds, letter formation and how to read three letter words.

Engineering and Technology is the topic that your student will learn during science this month! We highly encourage students to complete daily homework assignments and to read 20 minutes or more each night to help make academic progress! We look foward to having an amazing year together!




Grade 2 - Mrs. Cipriano and Miss Tyrrell

We are excited to start a new virtual/in-school year at Regan! Both Miss Tyrrell and Mrs. Cipriano's second graders are learning and adjusting to all our new online learning. Every night Chromebooks should be charged up for the students to use for the next day. Each afternoon the students need to complete 20 minutes- Math i-Ready, 20 minutes-LEXIA (if they have an account), 20 minutes-Fundations, and their special (Gym, Art, Music).

In math, we are discussing strategies such as: make A ten, counting on, addition and subtraction math facts, adding doubles, and doubles plus one. In reading/language arts, we are reading stories about friends and families, learning story elements, and discussing the beginning, middle and end of stories. In science, we started with learning about Unit 1-engineering and now Unit 2- Matter.

Please continue to read with your child each night and keep practicing your math facts (examples: 9+1=10, 8+8=16).

Grade 3 - Mr. Mitchell and Mrs. Schmied



Welcome Back! September has been a busy, interesting month! In addition to the third grade curriculum, our students have been learning how to log in to various programs we are using in class and at home. They have been using the new learning tool Kami to complete their digital assignments. The girls and boys are getting used to the "new" school routine.

We encourage you to have your child log in to Epic (link under Reading in Google Classroom) to practice reading. This will log the books and minutes spent reading. Some books even have a quiz to practice comprehension test-taking. Also, we encourage our students to practice addition and subtraction facts. We will begin multiplication facts in late October.

Every afternoon your child will be working on Fundations lessons, Math iReady, Wonders assignments, and their Specials.

Grade 4 - Mrs. Betancourt and Mr. Welch

First of all, the fourth grade team wants to thank you for your incredible patience over the past few weeks. Distance learning has been stressful for all involved, and we are grateful that you have been so understanding, especially regarding the technology issues.

With that being said, we are very excited to start the school year with your children! They have been wonderful to work with and we are confident that they are going to excel in fourth grade. By week three, we are ready to fully start working with Wonders, I-Ready, and Science. All learning will be done online using Google Classroom and Kami. We will be posting lessons, in class assignments, and lessons on those applications. Although it is always important, it is even more important now that you work with your children on their fact fluency (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division) and that you read with them every night. The more students practice these skills, the better they will get. If you have any questions at all, both fourth grade teachers are on Google Meets from 2:30-3:05 Monday through Friday. We are there to help both our students and parents to meet whatever needs they have.

<u>Grade 5 - Mrs. DeFazio and Mrs. Timaul</u>

This week in math, our fifth-graders are exploring Volume. Your child has already learned to find the area of a plane figure, such as a rectangle, by covering it with unit squares. Now your child is learning how to find the volume of a solid figure, such as a cube, by filling it with unit cubes.

In Science, our students are studying Unit 2 Matter. The focus of this unit is to develop a model to describe that matter is made of particles too small to be seen. Measure and graph quantities to provide evidence that regardless of the type of change that occurs when heating, cooling, or mixing substances, the total weight of matter is conserved and make observations and measurements to identify materials based on their properties. As children work toward success with these performance expectations, they will learn about more than just science content. They will develop and use models, plan and carry out investigations, and use mathematics and computational thinking. To stay up to date with our progress, ask often about what's happening in science class.

In ELA, we will start Unit 1, "Eureka! I've got it!!" We will focus on the comprehension strategy of rereading to deepen understanding. The genre is Realistic Fiction. Our fifth graders are adjusting nicely to this new way of learning and we are super proud of them.

 groups instead of me. She will log in through our reading intervention classroom as well.
 We will work out the other details as we go along.
