

Renaissance Artist Brochure Project

You will be selecting an artist from the Renaissance period (1300-1450 AD) and then constructing a brochure that might be in a museum displaying this artist's work. Therefore your brochure should have a biography of the important aspects of the person's life, three of his works and descriptions of the works using the technical points you learned in class.

You will need to find the following information:

- Image of artist
- Biographical information about the artist
- 3 images of significant painting, sculpture, work or contribution by artist
- Information about each painting, sculpture, work, or contribution you chose.

Strategies to Use:

Use **Destiny** to locate books and online resources. Use the **Web Express** feature in Destiny to access recommended internet sites for additional information about the life of your artist and his work.

Once you have located appropriate information then you need to read and take notes **IN YOUR OWN WORDS** on the life of your artist. Include biographical information such as date of birth, death, nationality, influence, family, education, and career. In addition you will need to include three works of art as well as an actual image of your artist.

Make a "story map" design of the brochure. Use the diagram below to help you.

Use the directions for "creating a brochure" in **Publisher** which can be found electronically under the "How To" section in the Virtual Library.

Required Format: You will be printing a double sided document; therefore the layout of your brochure is extremely important. Set up for the brochure is:
