

### **JCS Remote Learning Overview**

#### Overview

- Option available for families who would rather their student engage in online rather than in-person learning.
- Access materials anywhere at any time.
- Virtual curriculum features courses in math, science, language arts, world languages, social studies, and electives.

#### **Benefits**

- Learn from the comfort of your own home.
- Students can participate in athletics, clubs and extracurricular activities after regular school hours.
- Students will be provided with district issued devices as needed.

## What to Expect During Students' First Weeks of School for Remote Learners

During the first weeks of school, students will participate in the following tasks based on the learning framework option chosen by parent.

- Students will be issued a laptop or iPad along with device training, if needed.
- School administration will inform parents of remote learning expectations and attendance.
- School administrators will provide information to parents and students to help them become familiar in accessing and using Schoology to communicate with teacher, retrieve instruction and assignments, submit completed assignment tasks, and locate grade level curriculum (SchoolsPLP).
- Students will be administered beginning of year assessments so educational plans can be developed to address academic needs.
- Students will begin receiving grade level instruction and assignments using the learning management system (Schoology) and the online curriculum (SchoolsPLP).

### **FAQ**

**Q:** How will this look for students? Each day students will log into SchoolsPLP, They will move through the 5 steps of each lesson. If they have questions or need assistance, parents or guardians should assist their child. Contacts can also be made to the school's designated teacher.

- Q: Do students work at their own pace? Students can complete their work at a time each day convenient to them. However, weekly goals will be established to ensure students stay on track to complete their lessons by the designated time.
- Q: Is there a time frame for each lesson to be completed? Yes, the course would have to be completed in the same time frame as a traditional course (for example...9-weeks, semester, yearly)
- Q: When are teachers available? Only during school hours? What about evening hours? Yes, teachers will be available to provide support during the school day hours. Contact information will be provided by each individual school.
- Q: Can students do these lessons outside of the school day so that parents can work? Students can complete their work at a time each day convenient to them.
- **Q:** Are there AP courses available? Several AP courses are available through SchoolsPLP. If a student would like to take an AP course that is not supported by SchoolsPLP, they should contact their school counselor or administrator for options.
- **Q:** How are students graded/assessed? SchoolsPLP has built in assessments that will be used to help determine a student's grade for the course.
- Q: Will students be studying the same material as traditional students so that if they decide to transition back to the classroom they will be on track with those students? The courses in SchoolsPLP will cover the required standards for courses offered. Schools will work to align when these standards are taught to try and mirror the pacing of a traditional classroom.
- **Q:** What about after school activities? Secondary (grades 7-12) students choosing the Remote Learning Plan will be able to participate in after-school athletics or other extracurricular activities. Please contact the school administrator for more information.
- **Q:** What about students who have an Individual Education Plan? IEPs plan will be reviewed at the beginning of the school year and plans for meeting the goals of the IEP and needed accommodations will be put into place.

9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students – SchoolsPLP & ACCESS Franchise Model (The course plan for high school students will be determined based on courses offered, student requests, and teacher plans.
