## 2019-2020 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Course Information Sheet Holman Middle School

Understanding the scheduling process is one of the most important steps you can make to ensure success in middle school. Your school counselor, along with your current teachers, will assist you every step of the way.

- Course selections for next school year will be done online through PowerSchool. This form explains the 8<sup>th</sup> grade required courses and available elective options. Please refer to the "Important Scheduling Information and Dates" page to view the time-frame of the scheduling process and read the information concerning the parent online process.
- Eighth grade students will take a total of 8 classes. There will be six **REQUIRED** classes: English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Health and PE, and PRIDE.
- Each student will also take **TWO** elective classes. Students will choose TWO elective options and one alternate, in case the first or second choice is dropped, full, or presents a scheduling conflict with a required course.
- > School counselors will be meeting with students to review course selections, however if your child has an interest in attending a specialty center please be sure to communicate this with your child's school counselor. Some specialty centers have course requirements and your child's school counselor can review these requirements with you to be sure you are aware.
