











COMMERCIAL PHOTOGRAPHY

'So You Want To Be A Commercial Photographer?" Now is the best time to learn the basics of commercial photography by combining both analog (Film Photography) and digital photography. What is 35 mm film? How many? What is a crop sensor and a full frame sensor? What is a beauty dish and what is it used for? What's a strobe? These are just a few of the questions you will be able to answer in this basic course as well as the principles of composition and lighting, the visual characteristics and differences between analog and digital outputs. Students will also produce black & white and color images under natural and studio lighting conditions in both analog (film photography) and digital outputs with an introduction to the digital darkroom software - Photoshop. 



WHAT IS COMMUNITY CLASSROOM?

Community Classroom is unpaid training at a job site. Training usually takes place during your class hours. It is your responsibility to secure transportation to and from the site. Student must be at least 16 years old.

IS THERE A FEE FOR ROP CLASSES?

As of July 1, 2015, BVROP is no longer direct-funded by the State of California. BVROP is now funded by our member districts, as a service provider supporting their local control accountability plans (LCAPs).

Our agreement with our member districts for these funds provides that ROP/CTE services are reserved for students attending high schools, continuation high schools, and alternative high schools belonging to Chaffey JUHSD, Chino Valley USD, Claremont USD, and Upland USD.

All other grade 9-12 students or school entities may access BVROP services by contacting Forest DeRenzo, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services (forest_derenzo@bvrop.org) to obtain the fee-for-service costs and registration protocol.

CAN I RECEIVE COLLEGE CREDIT?


Yes. Several classes have articulation agreements with our neighboring community colleges. Most courses require a score of at least 80% on the final and/or articulation exam, a final course grade of "B" or higher, and enrollment with the community college upon high school graduation. Please consult with the teacher for specific steps and grading criteria.

IS THERE AN AGE REQUIREMENT?

Some classes have an age requirement. Courses which have requirements and/or prerequisites can be found at the conclusion of each course description.

CAN MY STUDENT ATTEND CLASS AT A DIFFERENT DISTRICT OR CAMPUS?

Student must receive prior approval from the Administrator of the campus where the class is being offered. Contact your school Career Technician.




The Student on a Career Track
