SAA1 MUSICAL THEATER ACADEMY (Grades 7-10) *Taught by Michael Hunter*

DISNEY'S "FROZEN JR" Musical Theater Academy is a three-week intensive program that focuses on learning and implementing the basic elements of successful on-stage training in acting, vocal music, and dance in a fun, engaging, and rewarding camp-like atmosphere. The program will culminate in a performance of Disney's *Frozen Jr* on Friday, July 26 at 7:00PM. **Limit 25 cast members.** Disney's *Frozen Jr.* is a great introduction to the world of musical theater. Young performers will love its humor, warmth, and message while learning music and choreography and staging a full scale production.

SAA2 COMPREHENSIVE ART EXPERIENCE (Grades 4-7) *Taught by Carolyn Olivieri*

NATURE INSPIRED ART Using organic, natural shapes and forms such as plants, sea life, animals, birds, and other images from the natural world as inspiration, we will explore a variety of materials to create original works of art. Students may bring their own objects or photographs to also inspire their imaginations and creativity.

LANDSCAPE DRAWING & PAINTING This will be a fun, collaborative class focusing on technique and individual drawing and painting styles. Students will learn how to develop a composition using a variety of resources to create acrylic paintings.

MULTICULTURAL GLOBAL ARTS During this class students will have the opportunity to learn about and be inspired by diverse multicultural art and craft from around the world. Students will experience creating art forms using a variety of materials to develop their own ideas relating to what they have learned. Come ready to discover, interpret, and express yourself!

SAA3 DIVE INTO COMICS (Grades 8-12) *Taught by Matt Ryan*

CHARACTER DESIGN Join in a workshop that truly examines character through motivation, costumes, posture and more. This session requires a balance of writing, drawing and research. Class work can be done digitally or tangibly.

COMIC CONSTRUCTION In this workshop, students will plan, write, layout and execute their own comic story! All experience levels are welcome! Student can work digitally or tangibly.

WEB COMICS 101 Welcome to the digital age! We have our comic, now what?! We will come up with a structure for our comic delivery. A laptop or tablet device is required for this workshop.

SAA4 CERAMICS EXPLORATION (Grades 8-12) *Taught by Amy Sciongay*

WHEEL THROWING In this three-week class, students will have the opportunity to build their skill set by throwing on the potter's wheel. Students will learn to throw basic wheel thrown forms or move on to larger amounts of clay and create more sophisticated pieces. Students may have minimal or advanced experience, and all are welcome! With feedback and guidance from the ceramics instructor, students will have the artistic freedom to explore the possibilities that functional wheel thrown pottery has to offer.

HANDBUILDING This ceramics course will encourage students to design and construct original three dimensional sculptures. Students will learn basic building techniques such as coil and slab building, while exploring their own imaginative ideas and inventions. This class emphasizes creative thought and expression through clay and is appropriate for all levels.

FREE STUDIO Students will be able to use this time to practice and refine the skills they have learned from our other two ceramics courses. Students are able to freely create with one-on-one guidance from their instructor.

SAA5 DIGITAL DESIGN (Grades 4-7) *Taught by Hailey Winschel and Emma Moran*

BASICS OF PHOTOGRAPHY Become a photographer and show off your skills by using studio equipment, editing in PhotoShop, and preparing work for the summer art show. Photographic walks and studio photography are planned to inspire you. Learn how to use your phone, family camera, or use one of ours. Show the world how you see it through the camera lens.

VIDEO VENTURES In this class, students will explore the world of animation. Learn traditional and digital methods of animating to bring characters and scenes to life on screen! Turn your story into a movie with new friends and have fun trying new techniques.

DIGITAL DESIGN In this class you will use traditional methods of making art including, painting, sculpture, natural installation and mixed media to create artwork. The original artwork will then be photographed or scanned to enhance using technological processes. It is the BEST of both worlds.

All classes except for Musical Theater Academy will be held at Simsbury High School. Musical Theater Academy will be at Henry James Memorial School. Although SAA's intent is to conduct fully in-person classes, depending on COVID-19 and the Simsbury Public Schools guidelines, classes may take place online.
