UNDERSTANDING THE SMARTER BALANCED TEST (SBAC)



In March Bristol students in grades 3-8 and 11 will take the Smarter Balanced Test in English/Language Arts and Math on the computer.



FACT:

The Smarter Balanced Test replaces the CMT and CAPT test except in Science.

Fiction: A student's personal information will be shared.

Fact: All student information will be protected and never shared.



Fiction: The scores students will achieve on this year's test will be part of their records.



Fact: This is a practice test. Scores will not be part of student's records. The practice test will give students a chance to get used to the new "Computer" format in a non-stressful situation and give teachers and administrators information on how to help students achieve to their full potential.

Fiction: The test has no accommodations for Special Education and English language learners.

Fact: Accommodations are being developed for all students.



Fiction: Students will no longer read fiction (Dr. Seuss).

Fact: Students will read a combination of fiction and non-fiction. Science, history and math books are considered non-fiction.

Fiction: The test will concentrate on basic math facts.

Fact: The test will focus on understanding math skills and linking them to solving real- world problems.

Fact: The Smarter Balanced Test is designed to test students on the skills and knowledge needed to prepare them for success in college and the workplace.
