COMPUTATION OF GPA

Muscle Shoals High School does not rank students until the end of senior year. Class rank is determined by overall numerical average from all courses attempted.

Grades reported on the transcript are unweighted, with the exception of AP classes, Anatomy, and Physics, which carry an additional GPA point, as well as up to five points on the final numerical average. Students who have taken an AP class have weighted GPAs, whereas students who have not taken an AP class have unweighted GPAs. GPA is calculated using a 4.0 scale and semester grades from all courses attempted.

SCHOOL INFORMATION


Classes meet on a block schedule, whereby students meet daily in homeroom and then in each of four classes for ninety-six minutes, scheduled into fall and spring semesters. All students are required to attend all classes each day. This opportunity for eight credits each year allows for extra elective classes, some of which may be taken at the Muscle Shoals Career Academy (MSCA). Students may be eligible for Early Admission and/ or Dual Enrollment programs at local colleges. Service hours are not required for graduation.






Cumulative GPA End of Junior Year Class of 2023

CURRICULUM

Graduation Requirements:

28 credits including 4 English, 4 mathematics (must include the math sequence through Algebra II), 4 science (must include Biology and a physical science), 4 social sciences, 1 fine art, Career Prep A & B, 1/2 health education, 1 physical education, and 8 electives.

Advanced Endorsement Requirements:

30 credits including 4 English, 4 mathematics that include Algebra II/Trig, 4 science (must include Biology, a physical science, and two advanced sciences), 4 social sciences, 2 foreign language, 1 fine art, Career Prep A & B, 1/2 health education, 1 physical education, and 8 electives.

Honors Endorsement Requirements:

30 credits including 4 English, 4 mathematics that include Pre-Calculus, 4 science (must include Biology, Chemistry, and at least one more advanced science), 4 social sciences, 2 foreign language, 1 fine art, Career Prep A & B, 1/2 health education, 1 physical education, and 8 electives. At least four classes must be A.P.

NOTE: The State of Alabama requires students have the following social science credits to graduate: 1 World History, 2 U.S. History (I and II), 1/2 U.S. Government, and 1/2 Economics.
