#### INTRODUCTION

Welcome to Biology Living Earth! It is an exciting time in education as we begin to explore the Next Generation Science Standards. These standards push thinking further and allow students to become 21<sup>st</sup> century thinkers. This year we will have six different units of interest broken over 2 semesters:

#### Semester 1

Unit 0: Basic Science Skills

Unit 1: Ecosystem Interaction and Energy

Unit 2: Structure, Function, Growth

Unit 3: History of Earth's Atmosphere/ Photosynthesis & Respiration

#### Semester 2

Unit 4: Evolution

Unit 5: Inheritance of Traits Unit 6: Ecosystem Stability

Notice that we begin the year with ecology and end the year with ecology. The idea is that we move full circle in our biological lessons. Units are meant to add on to one another and create a systematic story that enhances our ability to observe and make sense of the biological world around us!

Students should be able to clearly communicate what they have learned, especially in writing. You should be prepared for many presentations, group work, labs, and scientific debates/arguments.

# **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Participate in experiments and activities in class or online
- Completion of assignments or activities given as homework
- Wear closed toe shoes and be PREPARED for lab days (when we can return to school)
- Be responsible for making up and turning in various classwork, homework, activities, tests, quizzes, and labs
- Have all the materials needed for class every day
- ullet Be in your assigned seat and ready to learn BEFORE the bell rings
- Access to computer, Google classroom, working video + speaker functions on computer.

#### **COURSEWORK**

Each unit of study will require a combination of vocabulary, lab work, worksheets, lecture & reading notes, online self assessments, and evaluation of progress by tests and quizzes. All tests will be announced while quizzes may be both announced and unannounced.

#### **COURSE AGENDA**

Students will be informed through weekly updates. It is the responsibility of the student to know all due dates for course work as outlined in the weekly update. It is hoped that this will assist the student in keeping up with coursework in an organized and timely manner. AGENDA WILL BE POSTED AT THE BEGINNING OF THE WEEK ON GOOGLE CLASSROOM. IT IS YOUR RESPONIBILITY TO READ IT. It will also be posted in the classroom.

Labs (any assignment Lab related)	20%
Homework/Participation/Notebook Checks	20%

- All students will take a final exam each semester.
- Grades will be posted online and will be updated bi-weekly. It is your responsibility to check your grade and bring to my attention any discrepancies immediately. This is one reason you should keep all old work. Mistakes can happen and your corrected paper is evidence to prove you turned in the assignment.
- Limited extra credit opportunities will be announced.

#### Notebook Checks

Since we are not able to start the year in person I still want you to take notes ON PAPER. I would recommend a spiral or composition notebook. It will be a great way to keep track of all your notes. Create a table of contents to keep things organized. Notes do not have to be copied word for word but I expect to see the majority of information recorded in your notebook in your OWN writing. The PowerPoints will explain what to write down at times. Notes will most often be assigned for homework and we will review material in class. You must sign each page of your notebook before submitting your notes to Google classroom for points. I may or may not announce when notebook checks are so be prepared!

Late work will only be accepted within the current unit of study for 50% credit.

# ONLY EXCUSED ABSENT WORK ACCEPTED FOR FULL CREDIT.

• If you are absent and it is excused, it is **your responsibility** to turn in make-up work. TALK TO ME AFTER CLASS/OFFICE HOURS/EMAIL.

- I expect students to be academically responsible at all times. Most exams will be open note this year. There will be announced and unannounced quizzes.
