SAT/ACT Testing

- **♦** How many times should I take the SAT?
 - Register for SATs at www.collegeboard.org
 - Send scores directly to colleges. Colleges/universities require that scores are submitted directly from the College Board.
- Do I need to take SAT Subject Tests?
 - Achievement tests
 - Know how many you need to take check school's website
- **♦** Should I take the ACT instead of SAT?
 - Register for ACTs at www.act.org
 - English, Mathematics, Reading, Science, Optional Writing take it with writing
 - * ACT with writing can be accepted instead of SAT subject tests at many schools.

Pay attention to application deadline dates and required paperwork

Key Terms

- **Early Decision (Only 1 School): These offers are binding.**
 - If you are accepted to this school, you are pledging to attend, without regard to financial assistance!
- ***** Early Action (multiple schools)
 - This is not binding, but allows students to receive notification sooner.
- Regular Admission
 - Decision in the spring or earlier.
- **Rolling Admission apply early**
 - Applications are reviewed as they are received. An admissions decision is made once the committee has reviewed all of the materials.







- Used by over 600 schools







Steps to Complete the FERPA


If using the Common Application, complete all steps in colleges I'm applying to:

- Sign the CA FERPA Waiver & Authorization.
- Complete the "Common App Account Match," which permits BHS to prepare and release your information.




Now Match Your FERPA



Application Checklist

- **Complete** *application and fee payment online*
- **Essay:** upload to online application
- Resume (highly recommended): upload to online application or email to admissions
- Send any other supporting documents you want to include (ex: art portfolio)
- Send your SAT scores via Collegeboard.org AND/OR ACT scores via ACT.org
- Request *transcripts* on Naviance
- Request a teacher letter and counselor letter if needed


The Application Essay

- Always answer the question asked: don't try to make one essay answer every question
- Write about a topic that you are passionate about put your personality into it!
- Get feedback...Ask your counselor or English teacher to review your essay for content. You are responsible for spelling and grammar!




Resume

- Makes your application package 3-D
- Review and update your resume on Naviance
- Your teacher or counselor may request your resume if they are writing you a recommendation letter




Requesting Transcripts ALLOW AT LEAST 10 SCHOOL DAYS



Letters of Recommendation

Teacher Letters:


- Be aware of the number of letters a college requires and allows.
- Talk with your teachers, and submit any materials they require.
- Provide them with at least ten school days before the deadline.
- Request that teacher on Naviance, and select the appropriate schools.
- Follow up with a written note of thanks.




Letters of Recommendation

Counselor Letters:

- Determine which schools require counselor letters.
- Parents Complete the Parent Input form on / Naviance.
- Students Complete the Student Questionnaire on Naviance.
- E-mail your counselor to request a letter.





Important Deadlines

- Give the counselor at least 10 school days for processing before a deadline.
- Please pay attention to those that fall around holidays.
- Counselors cannot accommodate last minute applications!




