- File beginning: October 1, 2021 & apply no matter what school you attend
- The FAFSA application is always **FREE** and is sponsored by the US Department of Education.
- Filing online requires both student and parent to have an FSA ID.

- Undocumented Students
- With or without DACA
- TPS Status
- U Visa Holders



Additional Requirements

- Must be eligible to submit the nonresident tuition exemption
- Males 18-25 yrs. old must register for Selective Service
 - Males between the age of 18 and 25 who complete the California Dream Act Application (CADAA) are still required to register for Selective Service CADAA filers must print out the registration form and mail it in. They should do this as soon as they turn 17 and three months old

A	ENGLISH 4 Years College Preparatory
B	MATHEMATICS 3 Years Required; 4 Years Recommended Integrated Math 1-3
C	HISTORY 2 Years Required U.S. History or U.S. Government and World History
D	LABORATORY SCIENCE 2 Years Required; 3 Years Recommended Biology CP, Chemistry, Physics
E	LOTE (Language Other Than English) 2 Years Same Language Required; 3 Years Recommended
F	VISUAL and PERFORMING ARTS 1 Year Required; refer to Chino High School's UC/CSU Approved Course List
G	COLLEGE PREP ELECTIVE Refer to Chino High School's UC/CSU Approved Course List

CSU Admissions



- Application window opens **October 1, 2021 to November 30, 2021**
- Complete an application for each campus - applications are sent to each campus
- The minimum required GPA for admission eligibility is a 2.0
- **SAT/ACT test scores are not required and are not considered for admissions**
- There is an application fee - **fee waivers are available within the application.**
- GPA is based on grades earned during the sophomore and junior years of high school (a-g approved courses only)
- A supplemental application may be encouraged for students applying for impacted majors;

UC Admissions



- The UC Admissions uses the [Comprehensive Review](#), where college admissions evaluators look beyond grades to evaluate applicants' academic achievement in light of the opportunities available to them and the capacity each student demonstrates to contribute to the intellectual life of the campus.
- There is an application fee - **fee waiver available within the application.**
- The UC application evaluation considerations consists of the following:
 - A. Academic GPA in all completed A-G courses
 - B. Personal Insight Questions
 - C. Number of UC approved honors and AP courses
 - D. **SAT/ACT Tests optional and not considered for a**

Who Should Apply for EOP Educational Opportunity Program?

What is EOP?

- The Educational Opportunity Program designs, administers, and supports programs that deliver access and retention services to historically low income and educationally disadvantaged students.
- An EOP student has the potential to perform satisfactorily in the CSU but has not been able to realize this potential because of economic or educational background.
- Embedded with the CSU application. **It is a separate application!**
- Applicants must qualify for Financial Aid and submit the materials requested by the Financial Aid Office if they wish to be considered for an EOP grant or other financial assistance.

Private Colleges

- **76+ campuses in California**, each with a unique focus
- **Professors** – *not teaching assistants* – teach courses.
- Private schools tend to have a more **personal approach** to education. Private school application **deadlines** are not uniform.
- **Tuition and fees** can be in excess of \$30,000 a year – however, roughly 8 out of 10 students who attend private schools receive some forms of **financial aid!** Need-based and/or academic merit!
- Applications for most private universities can be submitted through send.edu.org and www.commonapp.com.
- Students should create their accounts through send.edu.org or commonapp.org and include their teachers' and counselor's emails so that all recommendations, transcripts and other documents can be electronically submitted on their behalf.

Letter of Recommendation Form

- Letters of recommendations are only part of the private college applications, as well as scholarship applications.
- **Speak to your teachers and/or counselors ASAP for a letter of recommendation if needed.**
- **UC/CSU's do not need a letter of recommendation**

Transcripts



- Unofficial transcripts can be sent to you electronically or printed and received in hard copy
- **Official Transcripts** are ordered through the CHS Records Office or you can order through Parchment, which is available on our CHS Counseling Website. Click on the link below!

- College fairs

- ***Include any events that may have changed due to COVID19**

Tips

- **Apply to more than one campus!!**
 - **apply to programs that, while not your first choice, will allow you to fulfill your educational goals**
 - **Apply as soon as the window opens for colleges (August 1 for UC's & October 1 for CSU's)**
 - **Meet all application deadlines**
- **Apply for Financial Aid beginning October 1, 2021**
- **Check your email and school portal for updates from your school!!**
- **Use a tasteful email address that you will check often**
- **Proofread your application for misspellings and grammatical errors**
- **Read directions carefully**
- **Do not list extracurricular activities that *aren't legitimate***
- **Inform your school counselor where you have applied**
