Meet with your school counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate and fulfill college admission requirements. Register for the SAT and/or ACT Please check with individual colleges to see what testing is required, if any. Visit SAT/ACT website for updates regarding testing options. Look over college applications. Make note of all the pieces of information you will need to compile. Take every opportunity to get to know colleges. Participate in virtual college information sessions. Visit each individual college website for specific dates. Some colleges may allow in person visits. Narrow down your list of colleges. Gather information about the application and financial aid process at each school. Build your list of trade school and/or apprenticeship programs. Gather information about the application and financial aid process at each school. Create a checklist and calendar to keep track of tests dates, application due dates, and financial aid deadlines. Make note of the other materials, such as recommendations or essays you will need to complete your applications.
