As we move into September, our students are already into the first quarter learning. Classroom teachers have developed classroom procedures and routines. This school year we are excited to continue to collaborate with Extended Hours to provide before and after school care for Nisley students. We are also collaborating with Riverside Education Center (REC) to provide after school tutoring and enrichment to Nisley learners Tuesdays-Fridays. In the spring, be on the lookout for information on Lego Club. We are excited to provide different opportunities to our Nisley learners beyond the school day.

The beginning of the school year is the time we begin assessing learners and planning for their success. Learners in grades K-5 are assessed using DIBELS and those in Grades 2-5 will be taking NWEA. All Nisley learners will complete an individual reading conference with their teacher by mid-October. These assessments help teachers understand learners' strengths and better understand the next steps to meet the needs of our learners.

This year, we will continue to focus on creating a strong student culture and monitoring student learning. These goals will help our learners to be more successful when implementing the D51 Learning Model.






### \*PARENTS RIGHT TO KNOW\*

As a parent of a student at Nisley you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teacher who instructs your child. This is a requirement for all districts that receive Title I funds. Federal law allows you to request certain information about your student's classroom teacher. The law also requires the district to give you this information in a timely manner upon request. Listed below is the information about which you have the right to ask for

regarding each of your student's classroom teachers.

Whether the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) has licensed or endorsed your student's teacher for the grades and subjects taught. Whether CDE has decided that your student's teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances. The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and if so, the subject of the degrees. Whether any teachers' aides or similar para-educators provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.
