I am looking forward to seeing many of you at our Academic Awards Night this month. We will be recognizing 525 students that earned a 3.5 GPA last year. The high level of academic success at FMHS comes from a long tradition of academic excellence built over many years by our staff, parents and student body.

Advance Placement Scores Reach All Time High at FMHS: Congratulations to the students and staff of FMHS for record success in Advanced Placement courses last year. 620 AP Exams were administered (up 14 exams from 2018). 70% of our students received a qualifying score of 3+, which exceeds both the state (62%) and global average (60%).

Wildcat Time: This is a combination of access and advisory that takes place every Wednesday and Thursday (55 minutes). The advisory time (approximately 20 minutes) is to help students build connections with fellow classmates and their teacher, spark school spirit, celebrate what makes FMHS the best, teach life skills, explore opportunities beyond high school, reward achievement and reinforce mutual respect. The access time (approximately 30 minutes) is to provide student with access to staff as well as time for make-up work, test retakes, study time, extra help and working ahead. Please encourage your students to make the most of this time.

Student Parking: We are working diligently to provide parking spaces to as many students as possible. We have 460 parking spaces and our current enrollment is 1,410 - up 75 students over last year. Our priority is to provide all juniors and seniors with a permit. We are planning to issue permits to sophomores at the beginning of second semester when construction is completed and we get the northwest parking lot back. In the meantime, students that do not have a parking permit can park on Wildcat Avenue, at the tennis courts and at Living Waters Church. They may also choose to carpool with a sibling or upperclassmen or ride the bus.


