

<u>Arrival & Dismissal</u>

Attendance

CAFETERIA

Students can buy a hot lunch each day using the Point of Sale program which most of our students used at their elementary schools. Middle School lunch prices is \$2.25 and milk is \$.50. Student PINs that were assigned in elementary school remain the PINs in middle school. Parents can send money in with their child to be deposited in the student's POS account or deposit money electronically through the district web site www.wallingford.k12.ct.us then click on District Departments, Food Services, Meal Pay. Parents can request a print out of student purchases through the Food Service Department.

Any student who forgets his/her lunch and does not have money in their account can charge a lunch. This involves going to the desk and filling out a form which the student uses to purchase lunch. The student is expected to pay back the charge on the next school day CASH ONLY. Snacks can be purchased separately or in addition to a lunch. We also have a Snapple vending machine and a Dasani vending machine. No food is allowed to leave the café.
