REQUIREMENTS AND EXPECTATIONS

Attendance Policy

- + Students are only allowed ten absences per year
- + No more than four tardies per marking period
- + Two dismissals will be allowed per year unless there is an emergency

Activities

Mandatory:

- Students must engage in a minimum of one extracurricular activity, club, or sport per semester.
- Students must perform a minimum of 15 community service hours each year.

Grading System

• Students must maintain a grade of 75 in all classes.

• Additional help or study sessions will be arranged for struggling students.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

- + Currently we offer 14 Advanced Placement courses throughout the curriculum.
- + SOAR students are encouraged to take AP courses as part of their curriculum.
- + Success in AP courses at the high school level is a valid predictor of success in college. In addition, our syllabi are audited and certified by the College Board to ensure that work performed is at the college level.
- + If a student scores the required grade on the national exam, many colleges accept this as credit for freshman level classes. Some schools use the exam for class placement purposes.
