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Parent Involvement in Registration Process

- Review Program of Studies with your student
 - Student needs at least 3 alternate course choices
 - Students should not select all BTEC electives
 - After registration is complete, review students course selection in ParentPortal.
 - No paper copies sent home
 - If a student wants to make a change after registration is complete, they will need to complete a schedule change request.
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Enrollment and Schedule Changes

- Classes will only be offered if a significant number of students enroll
 - Schedule changes must be completed by the Friday of the first full week of classes.
 - Schedule change request forms are on the JRHS School Counseling website under “Forms” and also in Guidance.
 - Require a parent signature.
 - Second Semester schedule changes must be made by October 15.

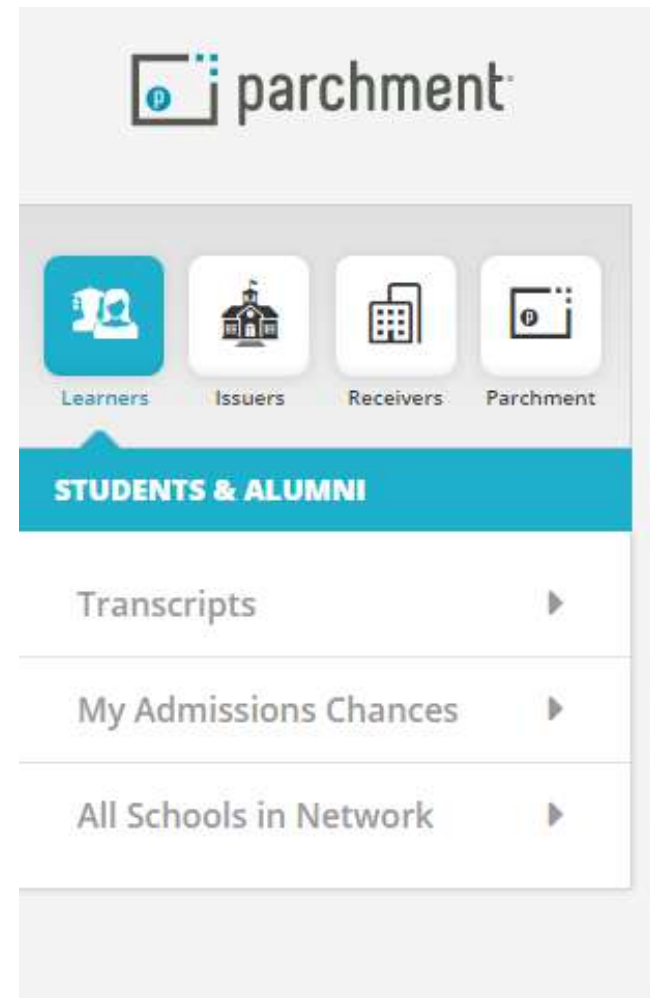

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Changes for 2017-2018 School Year

 - Payment due before 1st day of school
 - Students CAN take courses for Non-Dual Enrollment
 - July 1 - Deadline for VPT Testing
 - Not Dual Enrollment (New!)
 - Microsoft Office
 - Math for Liberal Arts
 - Auto Body
 - Cosmetology
 - Building Trades
 - Cosmetology 1 = Now 4 blocks!

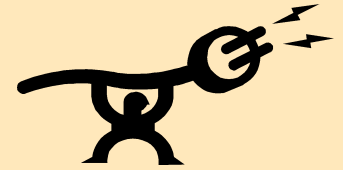

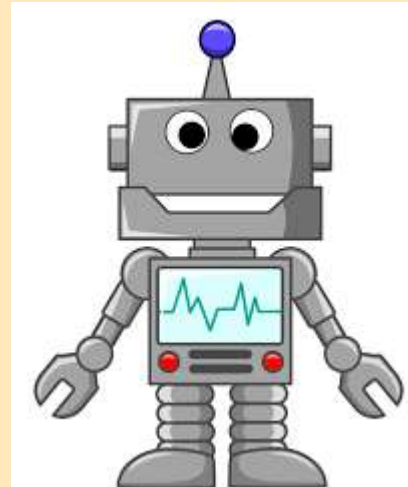

Dual Enrollment Eligibility

- Must meet the requirements set by VCCS
 - Apply to VWCC or DSLCC – Note EMPL ID
 - Meet Qualifying Score Criteria by July 1, 2017:
 - Virginia Placement Test (VPT) or
 - SAT, PSAT, or ACT Qualifying Score
 - Make sure your counselor gets a copy of your scores
 - Test @ JRHS, CAMS, BTEC in May or June or
- Test @ VWCC or DSLCC

Dual Enrollment Tuition



DUAL ENROLLMENT - Changes for 2017-18

- A portion of the community college tuition will be the responsibility of the parent.
- Payment will be collected during Schedule Pick-Up days in July and August.
- Your student will receive a handout during their registration meeting with Dual Enrollment details for parents to review.

Approximate COST per Credit = \$26.00

\$26 X 3 Credits = \$78

Advantages and Disadvantages of Dual Enrollment

Advantages:

- Earn high school and college credit
- Can save money
- Ease transition from high school to college
- May complete college degree quicker
- More likely to complete college degree or industry credential

Advantages and Disadvantages of Dual Enrollment

Disadvantages:

- Courses are rigorous and some students not able to adjust
- Courses require college level maturity and responsibility
- Poor grades stay (and follow) the student forever
- Grades can affect future college admission and financial aid
