

What do your counselors do?

- Meet with you and develop a college plan and update that plan annually
- Let you know what resources are available to you and how to find them
- Help you navigate the road to college
- Ensure that you get the most out of your four years at Upland High School

Earning Credits

- Five credits are awarded for each semester class passed
- Credits are issued only at the semester
- 230 credits required for graduation

High School Graduation Requirements

- A. History (social science) 30 credits (3 years)
- B. English 40 credits (4 years)
- C. Math 20 credits (2 years)
- D. Science 20 credits (2 years)
- E. Fine arts or Foreign language 10 credits (1 year)
- F. Physical Education 20 credits (2 years)
- G. Electives 90 credits (all 4 years)

College by the Numbers

- **80%** of what colleges look for are your grades and rigor of your coursework
- 10-20% Test Scores (SAT, ACT...)
- 0-10% Extra-Curricular (sports, clubs, band...)
- Students who meet the UC A-G requirements are three times more likely to transfer to a four year college if they start at a junior college.

UC/CSU REQUIREMENTS

A-G Eligibility requirements

a. History/Social Science 2 years

b. English 4 years

c. Math 3 years *

d. Lab Science 2 years *

e. Foreign Language 2 years *

f. Visual Performing Arts 1 year

g. Electives 1 year

*Recommended additional One or Two Years

What do colleges consider in the admissions process?

- The types of courses a student takes. Did he/she take and pass with a 'C' or better all of the required courses?
- Did he/she "stretch" and go beyond the minimum number of courses? They are looking for academic "depth and breadth."
- Grades student should strive for "A's & B's."
- Did a student challenge themselves?

Keys to Success at UHS
