

What is NOT Guaranteed?

- Admission to <u>Every</u> 4-Year University
 - Public Universities in LA are Participating
 - Transfer admission GPA standards differ, but LT graduate can expect special consideration.
- Admission to <u>Every</u> Degree Program
 - Some Programs Have Specific Admission Requirements
- Courses for Specific Majors
 - Not Automatically Satisfied

- Earn 2 Degrees in Same Time Frame

- Community Colleges are Open Admission
- If Stop after 2 Years -- Have a Marketable Associate Degree

The Transfer Degree Guarantee gives students the opportunity to easily transfer from a 2-year to 4-year institution.

TDG ensures that a community college student can transfer to a Louisiana 4-year public university and immediately enroll with junior-level status in most majors if that student completes 60 hours of prescribed courses, earns at least a "C" in each course, and is awarded a transfer associate degree.

The 60 hours of coursework includes 39 hours of general education courses and 21 hours of more specific courses.

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
