- Scores show how well you are learning
- Benchmarks show on track for college courses
- Scores show your academic strengths
- Scores show areas that need improvement
- Scores predict your future ACT scores
- Ideas to build your skills for the future

# Your PreACT Scores





#### Math Test

Determine the value of a constant or coefficient for an equation with no solution or infinitely many solutions

Using a specified model, make a prediction and compare the predicted values with the actual values in the data set

Within a context, compare the center of two separate data sets with different spreads

Determine whether two events are independent given their probabilities

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


- Don't engage them

### **WSFCS School Board Policy**

- No students should ever engage in or be subjected top bullying behavior.
- The target determines if he or she is experiencing a "hostile environment."
  - Bullying includes discriminating against someone because they are "different."
  - No person is allowed to retaliate against anyone who reports bullying behavior.
    - Any school employee who witnesses bullying behavior shall report it to the proper authority.
      - The Principal or Principal's desginee shall investigate the report.
