## SDC SPECIAL EDUCATION TEACHER

### DEFINITION

Provides individual programs for identified communicatively handicapped students based on academic, social and communication need which cannot be met in the regular classroom or other special education settings.

### ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Teaches Language Impaired students basic skills based on observable communication, intellectual, social, physical, and emotional needs of students as determined by their Individual Education Plans.
- Provides individual and small group instruction that addresses students' needs in math, reading, spelling, physical education, vocational education, social, self-help, communication, and when appropriate and if credential allows, articulation
- Confers with parents and program staff members on students' progress and updates IEPs at least annually.
- Confers periodically with psychologist, program director, and outside personnel, with regard to student welfare.
- Maintains appropriate student records as required.
- Provides a selected physical environment to establish and reinforce positive pupil behavior, attitudes, and social skills.
- Arranges, with principal, a schedule for mainstreaming students to regular classrooms, as determined by the IEP.
- Directs paraprofessional staff members in remediation and evaluation of pupil progress.
- Participates in curriculum and other developmental in-service programs at local schools as appropriate.
- Follows district approved curriculum with special emphasis on language development.
- Participates in staff and/or parent meetings.

### QUALIFICATIONS

#### Experience and Education:

- Possession of a valid California teaching credential authorizing service as an SDC teacher.
- Possession of valid Autism Authorization.
- Possession of a valid California EL authorization or equivalent.
- No Child Left Behind (NCLB) compliant in Elementary.

### OTHER DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Plans and coordinates the work of instructional aides, teacher assistants, Mental Health aides, volunteer and other paraprofessionals.

#### PHYSICAL CLASS:

MODERATE WORK - lifting 50 pounds maximum with frequent lifting and/or carrying objects weighing up to 25 pounds.

#### WORK AREA REQUIREMENTS:

Regular classroom, on the playground, parking lot, bus stop areas and possibly field trips. Ability to traverse campuses and sites of 10 to 40 acres which would include asphalt, grass on playgrounds and dirt.
