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GUIDANCE CORNER

<u>College Fair</u>—Daniel Hand High School recently had their annual College Fair the evening of April 23. There were over 120 college, career, technical, and post-secondary representatives available to meet with students and parents. The evening was a great success, and we thank everyone who attended.

<u>ASVAB Testing</u>—The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) Test was held on April 1, 2015. This widely used aptitude test measures a student's general learning ability and potential for success in occupations that require formal courses of instruction or on-the-job training. This year, we had 27 students take the exam.

<u>SAT Test</u> —DHHS hosted the SAT test on May 2nd. We had over 175 students take the test. Our students are happy to take the test at a familiar location, and we look forward to hosting the SAT test again next year.

<u>UCONN ECE</u>— Those students who have requested to take a UCONN ECE class for the 2015-2016 school year must complete the on line application with UCONN by June 1, 2015. Additionally, the course enrollment deadline is June 30, 2015. Students should see Mrs. Voytek in Guidance to pick up the ECE Consent Form which must be completed prior to applying and enrolling in courses.

The students listened to a lecture explaining the science behind Genetically Modified Organisms, toured the labs and greenhouse, and had time to ask questions of the scientists giving the tours. The facility was focused on genetically modifying corn for agricultural purposes. It was an interesting and educational experience for the students and chaperones. A special thank you to Mr. Russo, Mr. Gaskell, Mrs. Filippone, Mrs. Larizza, and Mrs. Hilmer for chaperoning.

Monday, March 30 through April 2nd, five representatives from the music department participated in the Connecticut Music Educators Association All State Music Festival in Hartford. These five students were selected after a two-tier audition process, competing against other high school students across the state in the second tier. This spring the Marine Science/Technology and Ecology classes worked together to help the Madison Shellfish Commission conduct a field survey of soft shell clams *Mya arenaria* on Seaview Beach. The purpose was to determine if healthy populations of large sized soft shell clams are present in enough number to be harvested. The survey of soft shell clams proved to be a success with 88 clams being caught in an hour. Marine science class then did a mathematical analysis based on surface area and number of clams caught and found that as many as 33,523 clams live at Seaview Beach. This number will be reported to the town officials and will most likely result in the clamming beds being opened again this season.

Dress Code

Students are expected to dress in a manner that is suitable for a school environment. Clothing and accessories must not jeopardize the health or safety of the wearers or others, or cause distraction or disruption of the educational process as determined by the school administration. Clothing advertising drugs or alcohol is inappropriate for school wear. Footwear and shirts must be worn at all times. Shirts may not have razor back straps or large armholes, and straps must be at least an inch wide. Shorts must have at least a 3 inch inseam and must be worn high enough to cover boxers. The wearing of head coverings in the school building, except for religious purposes, is not allowed. Any student dressed inappropriately will not be admitted to class.

PSAT/SAT/ACT for 2015-16 school year

A review course will be offered at Daniel Hand High School to prepare students for the redesigned PSAT and SAT. It will also include practice for the ACT. The class will meet for 10 sessions, Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 2:10-3:10 p.m. The first class will be on Tuesday, September 22th and the last class will be on Thursday, October 25th. The fee for the course is \$150.
