The law provides information on ways to implement steps to improve reading proficiency of public school kindergarten to third grade students and ensure those students are able to read at or above grade level by the end of third grade, by monitoring the progression of each student from one grade to another. Again, the teachers in our system are doing an outstanding job of teaching and monitoring progress of our students. Parents can be assured that we are always evaluating and re-evaluating instructional strategies to meet student needs.

#### **State Testing Dates April 6th-16th**

This State Assessment will be a little bit different this year. For the past two years we have been using an adaptive test, SCANTRON. This year will be our first opportunity to use the new state summative test, ACAP (Alabama Comprehensive Assessment Program). Different than the past wo years, this test is a standard based test and will measure where your child is to the grade level standards they are in. All 4<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will test over a two-week period April 6<sup>th</sup> –April 16<sup>th</sup>. There will be three parts for the Reading portion, two parts for the Math portion, and two parts for the Science. Our teachers and students are working hard preparing for this summative assessment coming up real soon.

Career readiness is more than mere buzz words to describe our goal for students at Jasper High School. The future success of our students is determined by their ability to learn, adapt and thrive in the face of difficult challenges. With school curriculum that is relevant to student interests and rigorous to our 21<sup>st</sup> century workforce, we seek to provide our students with the best learning opportunities possible. Over the final three months of the school year, our students will be collecting valuable personal data on their progress. On March 10<sup>th</sup>, JHS faculty will administer the ACT with writing to all juniors. For the first time in many years, all seniors will also have the opportunity to sit for the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) Test. Both exams offer students insight to their preparedness for life after high school. Specifically, the ASVAB can provide students with more information about their areas of interest and aptitude. Later in the spring, seniors will also be able to take the ACT Work Keys Exam, which is a workplace skill/placement exam. Each of these exams can provide students and their family with valuable information to help shape your career path.

As we near the conclusion of the school year, I encourage you to begin reviewing your child's completed courses. Over the next few months, we will begin the exciting task of building the new school year schedule by gathering all of the course requests from students. Our school has achieved great accomplishments in fine arts and athletics. Consequently, we would love to have more students involved next year. Additionally, please consider many of the courses and programs that set our system apart. Next year, we will continue to offer newer courses in computer science and pre-engineering. 




# **Jasper High Athletics**

The Viking men's and women's basketball teams recently competed in the 5A Area 11 Tournament. Our Lady Vikes finished as the Area Tournament Runners Up, earning a spot in the Sub-State for the first time since the '14-'15 season. Isaysia Mercer and Alex Oliver we're named to the 5A Area 11 All Tournament Team. Coach Blake Laney led the team to a season total of 19 wins, which is more than the last three years combined.

The Men's Hoops team under the lead of Coach Robert Epps claimed our 2nd strait 5A Area 11 Tournament Championship, only the 8th basketball area championship in school history. Trinity Epps, Brent Geeter, and Harrison Saunders we're named to the All Tournament Team. The Vikings then promptly knocked off last year's 5A State champ and #4 ranked Wenonah Dragons in the Sub-State, advancing to Regional Play for the first time since '10-'11 season.

The Lady Viking Indoor Track Team made history at the most recent AHSAA Indoor Track State Championships. Coach Eric Phillips and the ladies finished as the state Runners Up in class 4A-5A, the highest finish in the history of our school. We were narrowly edged out of a State Championship by Scottsboro who won on team points (64.5 to our 63.5). The Vikes place several athletes on the medal stand: Alex Oliver claimed a State Championship in the triple jump, finished 2nd in the long jump. McKinley Ferguson was a State Champion in the high jump. Maci Beaty won a State Championship in the 800 m run. We also had the 4x800 m relay team of Anna Mobley, Allie Bull, Makenna Lewis, and Maci Beaty take a 3rd place finish.

Viking Volleyball under the leadership of Coach Bobby Daniels is still raking in awards from their unprecedented back-to-back State Championship run. Senior McKinley Ferguson was recently named a First Team All-American by PrepSports, a National publication that featured athletes from 39 states on their annual All-American Team. Junior Alex Oliver was named an Honorable Mention All-American by the same publication. To our knowledge, Alex and McKinley are the first two volleyball All-Americans in school history.

Jasper Athletics is proud to welcome Coach Philip Bailey as our new Head Football Coach. Coach Bailey is not new to the Viking family, serving as our Offensive Coordinator for the past two seasons, as well as our Head Strength & Conditioning Coach. Under Bailey's leadership, Viking Football has averaged 40 points per game and amassed 22 wins & two region championship during his tenure. Prior to his time in Jasper, Coach Bailey saw unprecedented success as the OC at Eufaula and also as the Offensive Coordinator at Maryville College where his offenses averaged 40 points per game. Philip is married to Maddox librarian and assistant varsity cheer coach Molly Bailey, and they have two sons, Cooper and Wallace.
