What is the Advanced Studies Diploma?

The Advanced Studies Diploma is the highest academic honor offered at DHS. The benefits include earning college credit, increasing your ACT scores, and sitting on stage at graduation.

Advanced Studies Diploma REQUIREMENTS

Pass 18 Honors, Gifted, DE, and/or AP classes with a grade of C or better.

- 4 Honors, Gifted, Dual Enrollment, & AP English classes
- 4 Honors, Gifted, Dual Enrollment, & AP Math classes
- 4 Honors, Dual Enrollment, & AP Science classes
- 4 Honors, Dual Enrollment, & AP Social Studies classes (must include H Civics, APUSH)
- 2 additional Honors, Dual Enrollment, & AP classes of your choice

• Earn an overall **85 B average** in all Honors, Gifted, DE and AP classes.

Student Eligibility Guidelines: 2019-2020

Southeastern Louisiana University, in partnership with local high schools, is pleased to offer qualified students an opportunity to enroll in college courses while still attending high school. Dual enrollment courses are hybrid courses with all content delivered online OR in person *via* a Southeastern Instructor/Professor. The high school teacher serves as a facilitator by assisting with student registration and enrollment, proctoring exams as necessary, and through supplemental instruction, serving as a daily learning resource for students as they assimilate course content. The Southeastern Instructor/Professor serves as the instructor of record for all dual enrollment courses. Students will earn both high school and college credit for the courses in this program with final grades appearing on the permanent transcripts of both the high school and Southeastern Louisiana University. In order for students to enroll in Dual Enrollment courses, they must meet the eligibility requirements as outlined below and complete a Dual Enrollment Student Application. **Please note that high school students can earn a maximum of 27 credits from Southeastern while participating in the Dual Enrollment Program**.

Requirements: min 11th grade, ACT composite of 19 (ELA – 19, Math – 18)

**Only DE courses that qualify on the TOPS University 5-point scale are acceptable as Advanced Studies Diploma courses.

7 Dual Enrollment** classes will be offered at DHS

- 11th grade: English I in lieu of AP Language & Composition
 12th grade: English II in lieu of AP Literature & Composition
- > 11th or 12th grade: Algebra III in lieu of Advanced Math 1
- > 11th or 12th grade: College Trigonometry in lieu of Advanced Math 1
- >11th or 12th grade: Statistics in lieu of AP Statistics
- >11th grade: Chemistry I in lieu of Honors Chemistry I
- >11th or 12th grade: Spanish III and Spanish IV

*Please note: Dual enrollment credit is honored at Louisiana public universities and some private/out-of-state universities. Students planning to attend private and/or out-of-state schools should check with that potential university to determine if DE courses are accepted. Students are encouraged to enroll in comparable AP courses as well.

**Only DE courses that qualify on the TOPS University 5-point scale are acceptable as Advanced Studies Diploma courses.

Who can apply for Honors classes?

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To enroll in an Honors class at the freshman level, a student should ...

- have earned an <u>A</u> or a <u>B</u> in the preceding class.
- have a core GPA of 3.0.
- have scored Mastery or Advanced on LEAP tests.
- have strong teacher recommendations.

What are my choices? Choice 1:



Pursue the Advanced Studies Diploma. Choice 2:

Take Honors, DE, and AP classes in your area(s) of strength and/or interest.

Students can take 1, 2, 3, or 4 Honors courses in 9th-grade.

Choices include: Honors English I, Honors Geometry, Honors Biology, and Honors Civics.

<u>Note:</u> If a 9th-grader is in Algebra I and wants to take <u>pursue the</u> <u>Advanced Studies Diploma</u>, he/she must also take Honors Geometry in 9th grade.

How do I apply for Honors classes?

The application process:

- Obtain the Intent to Enroll packet from your middle school, the DHS website, or the DHS counselors.
- > Carefully read the cover page to understand the process.
- > Complete the one-page application.
 - Select the classes in which you want to enroll.
 - Sign the Commitment Oath on the application.
- > Make a copy of a recent writing sample to include with your application packet.
- Submit a copy of your most recent report card.
- Submit all components (TOGETHER) to DHS by May 1, 2020.
- Give the teacher recommendation forms to your teachers in a timely manner. Teachers will return the recs directly to DHS by May 1, 2020.

How does the application process work?

Your responsibilities:

Complete an *Advanced* **Studies** Intent to Enroll packet, choose your classes, sign the commitment oath, choose a writing sample, copy your report card, and submit all materials to DHS by MAY 1, 2020.

Our responsibilities:

• In early May:

The Advanced Studies Team will review applications, recommendations, writing samples, and grades.

• In late May:

Placement letters will be mailed home to the address provided.

*Be sure to check your email for updates/ requests concerning missing requirements.
