

Workforce System Primer


- → Colorado has 10 federal workforce areas, mostly run by large counties
- → One of those 10 areas is the Rural Consortium, a collective of 51 rural counties, broken into sub-regions
- → Workforce area must, by law, have a governance board
- → Sub-areas may have boards, Northwest (Grand, Jackson, Routt, Moffat & Rio Blanco) dissolved the board late 2018
- → Local Elected Officials (LEOs) previously participated on the sub-area board
- → Annual updates
- → Opportunities to serve on Consortium board




Workforce System Primer, Cont'd


- → Colorado Department of Labor and Employment
- → Focus on ensuring:
 - ◆ Job-seekers have access to meaningful employment
 - Business can attract the talent they need
- → Services include:
 - ◆ Job search, job preparation, resume writing, assessments, etc.
 - Training and intensive job coaching for those eligible
 - Business services
- → System sustains persistent funding cuts, focus on engaging partner/complimentary programming/services

- → Job seekers accessing workforce services quickly reenter the labor force, regardless of economic climate
- → Job seekers assisted by workforce staff see long-term wage growth over pre-entry

Takeaways

- As of 2019 the region's population increased by 8.2% since 2014, growing by 1,198. Population is expected to increase by 5.3% between 2019 and 2024, adding 828.
- From 2014 to 2019, jobs increased by 10.0% in Grand County, CO from 7,996 to 8,796. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 7.3% by 2.7%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate decreased from 69.5% to 65.8% between 2014 and 2019.
- Concerning educational attainment, 27.6% of Grand County, CO residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (8.7% above the national average), and 8.9% hold an Associate's Degree (0.8% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2019 are Other Amusement and Recreation Industries, Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.

Grand County Business Size





Of those who commute in, 22% drive 25-50 miles to work and 39% drive more than 50 miles.



Retirement risk is high in Grand County, CO. The national average for an area this size is 4,494 people 55 or older, while there are 5,637 here.




Racial diversity is low in Grand County, CO. The national average for an area this size is 6,151 racially diverse people, while there are 2,000 here.




Grand County Underemployment



Grand County Largest Occupations




Grand County Growth Occupations





2018 Median Hourly Earnings




Grand County Top Industries, FTE

Key Takeaways

- → From 2009 to 2015, unemployment in Grand County consistently spiked in May. After 2015 no pattern exists, indicating changes to the nature of seasonal employment.
- → Most occupations in Grand County require no formal education, and there is a significant gap between the number of residents with postsecondary degrees and opportunities matching their education level.
- → The average wage in Grand County is 37,128. Wages increased 17% from 2008-2018, with the largest gains in construction (31%) and manufacturing (30%).
- → Of the nearly 700 new jobs projected by 2024, 33% are expected to pay wages above the county's average hourly wage.
