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School Improvement Grant at Brookfield High School

Overview

Brookfield High School was identified as a Focus School for English Language Arts in the 2015-2016 school year based on the Connecticut State Department of Education accountability scores that were calculated using the Smarter Balanced assessment results from the 2014-2015 school year. English Language Arts are a focus because a significant gap in scores existed between high needs students (English Learners, Special Education, and Free and Reduced Lunch) and non-high needs students. Brookfield High School met the criteria to apply for a federal School Improvement Grant because the principal was in place for less than one year after being identified as a Focus School. The grant was written to improve literacy instruction across all levels with a more intensive approach to target high needs students.

Highlights of 5 year plan

 - STAR Reading – online adaptive assessment of student reading comprehension

GLOSSARY OF TERMS:

PROGRAMS & INSTRUCTION:

NGSS- Next Generation Science Standards integrating cross-cutting interdisciplinary concepts, content through scientific inquiry, and engineering design into the structure of science education K-12.

Non-Core 4- Subject areas other than, Literacy, Math, Social Studies, and Science.

Renzulli- A Schoolwide enrichment model, implemented as an enrichment program. The Renzulli Center for Creativity, Gifted Education, and Talent Development is affiliated with the University of Connecticut.

RULER- Emotional intelligence Strategy Program through the Yale University Emotional Intelligence Center. RULER is an acronym that stands for Recognizing, Understanding, Labeling, Expressing and Regulating emotions.

SEM- Schoolwide Enrichment Model

Smithsonian Science- NGSS aligned program, developed through the Smithsonian Science Education Center.

Sunday Reading Intervention- A structured, multisensory, systematic reading intervention program based on Orton Gillingham methods.

TAG- Talented and Gifted Program

TC- Teacher's College Reading and Writing Units of Study. Reading units are used K-5, with a pilot in grades 6-8. Writing units are used in grades K-8

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING:

BCBA- Board Certified Behavior Analyst

Changemaker Project- Grant-funded project awarded to Assistant Superintendent Ruby, in support of the RULER emotional intelligence learning. The work associated with this grant will support parents in developing meaningful questions to ask educators regarding their child's educational experience.

Collegial Calibrations- Administrative professional learning facilitated by ReVision Learning consultants for the purpose of enhancing teacher evaluation and feedback in support of student achievement and social-emotional learning.

Curriculum Boot Camp- A two day workshop focused on aligning curriculum and assessments to standards, integrating the new literacies into teaching and learning.

EI- Emotional intelligence in support of social-emotional learning.

ELL- English Language Learner

Glencoe Math- Secondary level math program, published by McGraw Hill Education, used in grades 6-8

IEP- An Individualized Education Program is a legal document required to support students being serviced through SpED.

My Math- Elementary level math program, published by McGraw Hill Education, used in grades K-5

PD- Professional development

Powerschool Analytics- Data warehouse system

Rubicon Atlas- Curriculum design and management system platform.

SBAC- The Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium created the computer-adaptive state assessment taken by all students in the state of Connecticut in grades 3-8

SCP- Strategic Coherence Plan

SIOP- Sheltered Instruction Observation Protocol is a research-based instructional model used to support EL students.

STAR Math- A computer adaptive assessment system from Renaissance Learning. It is used in grades 1-12 to screen and monitor student growth relative to the state standards.

ASSESSMENT:

DIBELS- Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy are a set of procedures and measures for screening and progress monitoring the acquisition of early literacy skills based on the continuum of reading. These assessments are used in grades K-6

Digital Portfolios- A student collection of artifacts that demonstrate learning and growth over time.

Formative Assessments- Assessments that take a variety of forms, occurring throughout and as part of the learning process. These assessments are used for learning.

Words Their Way - Developmental spelling assessment used in grades K-6

TESOL- Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages
