

- Students must complete at least 2 assignments weekly to remain enrolled in these courses.




ATTENDANCE

Parents/guardians will be contacted to advise them of excessive absences.

To Be Counted Present

- •Most courses will be taught synchronously, which means students will attend classes via web-conferencing (Zoom, Google Meet) and receive live instruction from teachers similar to the traditional setting. Other courses will be asynchronous which is student-paced and monitored by a teacher.
- •Students that maintain a 70 or above average will not have to attend ZOOM meetings on a daily basis. Students that do not maintain a 70 or better average will have to attend required ZOOM meetings (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday). *A student's eligibility for the 70 or above attendance exemption will be determined by the classroom teacher once grades have been entered for required course assignments.
- Attendance is also measured by completing and submitting assignments successfully; participating in course activities such as discussions and projects; and communicating with online teacher(s). Additionally, there will be opportunities for students to attend one-on-one, small group, and/or intervention/tutoring as needed.




Parent Portal

Intervention

Students who are failing to maintain adequate progress in the DCVS will be required to attend on-site remediation until the student has made satisfactory progress. Parents will be responsible for transportation.

- 1st week: Conference with student.
- **2nd week:** If any grade is below a 60 average, for a second consecutive week, the student will be required to report to the DCVS site for supplemental instruction in the course(s). A conference with the parent and the student may be required.
- **3rd week:** If any grade is below a 60 average for a third consecutive week, the student will continue to report to the DCVS site for supplemental instruction in the course(s) and mandatory monitoring. A second conference with the parent and the student will be required.
- 4th week: If any grade is below a 60 average for a fourth consecutive week, the student will be required to report to the DCVS site for supplemental instruction in all courses and mandatory monitoring. In addition, the student will be placed on academic probation for the remainder of the grading period.



Zoom Tips



Virtual Café Dress Code

Students are required to follow the DCS dress code when entering DCVS virtual café.



All clothing must be properly fitted. Sagging and excessively tight clothing are prohibited.



Males and females are not allowed to wear hats, head coverings, hoods, sports headbands, or ear muffs inside the buildings. Bandanas and du-rags of any color are not to be worn on any part of the body nor carried in or tied on book bags or other bags.



No decals, slogans, or sayings on clothing and/or personal items that contain references to illegal or immoral behaviors. Decals, slogans, or sayings that advertise alcohol, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, weapons, gangs, or tobacco products are not allowed. Anything that promotes racial division or violence, lewd or vulgar sayings on clothing and/or personal items is not allowed.



Any student's dress or personal appearance that the administration believes is disruptive and interferes with a safe and secure learning environment will be dealt with on an individual basis. School administrators will use their discretion to determine the appropriateness of a student's dress.


