



Hungarian Jews and the Holocaust: A Tribute to Agnes Tennenbaum



For ten years, 94 year old Holocaust survivor Agnes Tennenbaum has read her stories and poems to many groups of students and adults in the Mobile area. Agnes grew up in Miskolc, Hungary. She and her family were arrested in 1943. She spent the last two years of the war prisoner, first in Auschwitz-Birkenau and then in the Allendorf (Germany) munitions factory. To honor both her experience and her generosity, this workshop will focus on the Holocaust as experienced by Hungarian Jews with emphasis on conditions in her hometown of Miskolc. Participants will receive curriculum booklets featuring Agnes' personal history. Facilitator Plater Robinson is Holocaust Specialist for The Southern Institute, Tulane. 

The Marzano Research Group, based upon the work of Dr. Robert Marzano, will present onsite PD for 6 days total. Each school will send a leadership team that will be responsible for sharing information learned during the training in their own schools and for piloting The Art and Science of Teaching.

The training helps participants combine a model of effective instruction with goal setting, focused practice, focused feedback, and observations to improve instructional practices. Included are 280 strategies related to the 41 elements of effective teaching shown to enhance student achievement.

Each participant will receive a year's license to access the Marzano Research Group's Compendium of Instructional Practices software. The online resource present 332 strategies related to the 43 elements of Dr. Marzano's updated Art and Science of Teaching framework. They will have access to videos explaining the elements and concepts, 43 downloadable PDF scales to implement learning goals, as well as define their practice.

They will also receive a copy of Dr. Marzano's book Becoming a Reflective Teacher

Participants: School leadership teams must be submitted for approval. Teams will be selected based upon criteria met and available space. During the time of slavery, when thousands of those who were held in bondage ran away to the North, and to Canada, with the help of the Underground Railroad, many thousands more ran South where they either found refuge with the Seminole Indians in the Everglades of Florida, or in communities of free people of color in coastal cities such as Mobile. In the Seminole Wars of the 1830s and earlier, runaway slaves fought along side the Indians in defense of their mutual freedom, and those wars were, in effect and by far, the largest slave uprisings in American history. Meanwhile, free blacks in Mobile and other places struggled to preserve and expand their own freedom, and often at great personal risk, they helped runaway slaves find sanctuary in their midst.
