Course Descriptions

Visual Arts

Making Jewelry

Students will create jewelry using a variety of different techniques, including beading, wire and macramé. Students may choose to design and make earrings, necklaces, bracelets and belts. Work will be displayed at a Share Day Exhibit.

Creating with Clay

Participants will have the opportunity to develop and refine their ceramic hand-building skills while tapping into their imaginations. Projects will include ceramic place settings, shoes and figurines, to name a few. Work will be displayed at a Share Day Exhibit.

Anime Cartooning

Students will explore various cartooning and anime styles with the end product a true to life cartoon cell. Work will be displayed at a Share Day Exhibit.

Scene Stealers

The setting of a theater performance provides the atmosphere for the actors to bring their story to life. With attention to detail and a knowledge of what scenes need to be created for the production, you can create scenes that have the best possible effect on the audience, giving them a glimpse of the world the characters inhabit. Be part of the creative crew that creates the set for our upcoming production of Shrek, Cyrano de Bergerac and Don Quixote.

3D Computer Graphics

Participants will learn basic skills in 3D computer graphics. We will be using the free downloadable software Blender to create a movable three-dimensional form. Students will be able to build upon the skills learned in this class if they download the software.



MUSIC

Piano

Students will benefit from the instruction of Mr. Haxhi, a veteran music teacher and the WAMS Performing Arts Department Chair. This class will focus on learning or enhancing piano skills and reading musical notation in our state of the art piano lab. Any ability level is welcome.

FILM

Film Explorations

Students will explore film genres, write movie reviews and create dramatic movie posters. The class will view and critique a variety of films. Students will be making connections to text, other film, or real world events.

THEATER ARTS

Performance Aspect

The WAMS summer program will be presenting a modified version of the musical Shrek. All students interested in performing will be given the opportunity to audition for acting, singing and dancing roles in the musical during the first day of the program, and all students that audition will be placed in the show. The play will be performed on the final day of the program. The musical will be directed by Mr. Scott Schulte with Ms. Vagnini serving as the vocal instructor and Ms. Brigid Thompson serving as the choreographer.

Production Aspect

The WAMS summer program will be presenting a modified version of the musical Shrek. All students interested in Technical and Production aspects of the program will be trained for tech and production and assigned to roles to assure that the show is fully supported. Students will be in charge of every aspect of production. You may find yourself designing the lighting and installing the design, or running the light board during the show. You could be mixing the mic during production, or costuming the actors. Anything technical you may want to do, you will get the training and have the opportunity to do. The play will be performed on the final day of the program. The musical will be directed by Mr. Scott Schulte with Ms. Vagnini serving as the vocal instructor and Ms. Brigid Thompson serving as choreographer.
