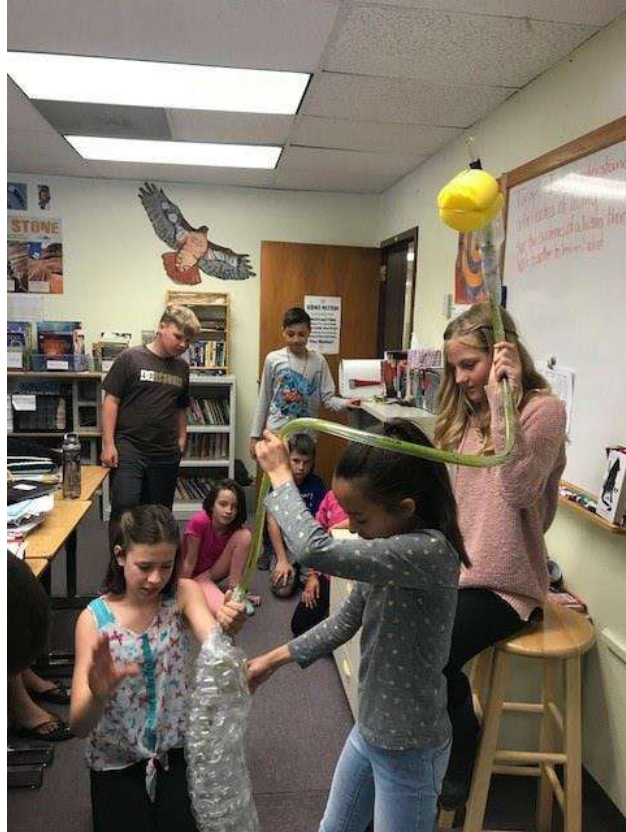


2 - 5th grade science students demonstrate body systems













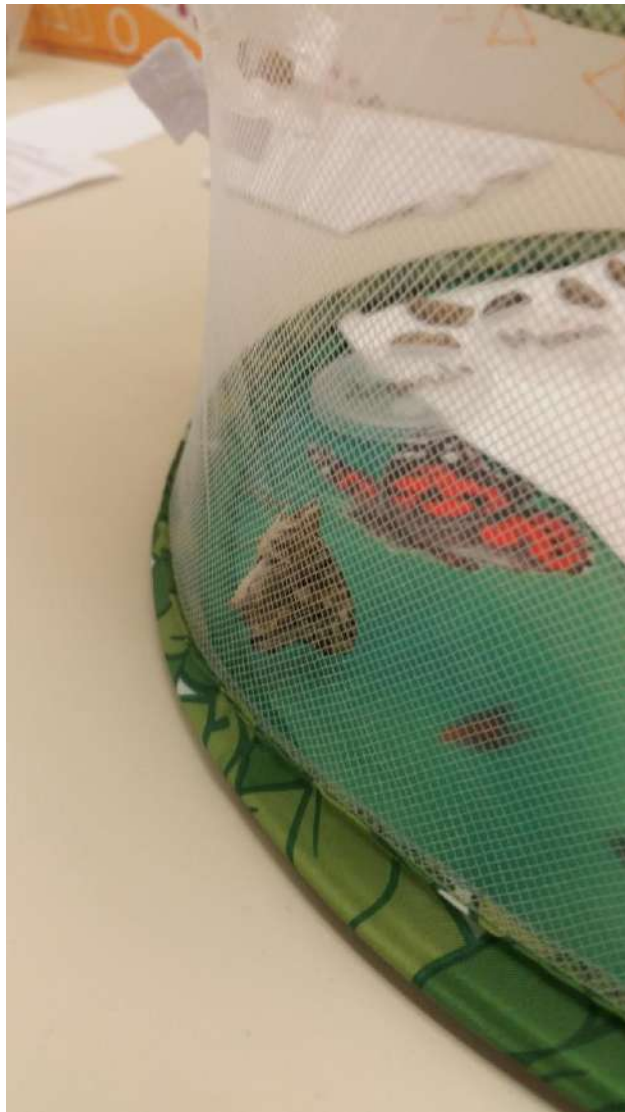

4 - Kindergarteners learn about the life cycle of butterflies

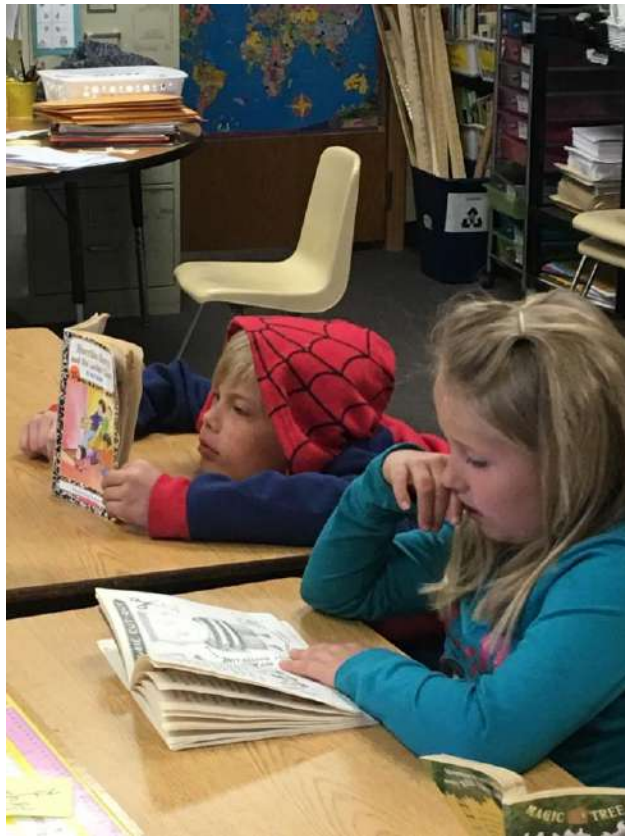

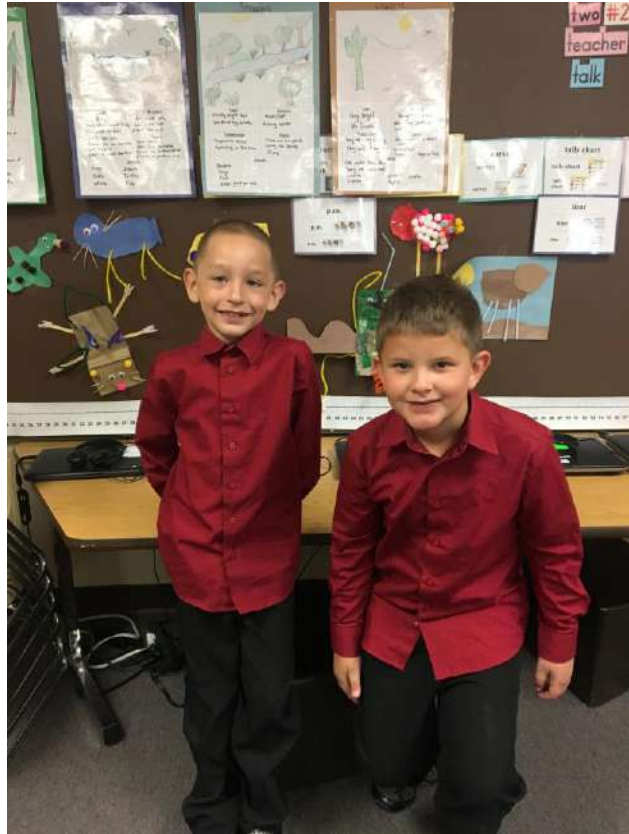

(I will send your student home with an informational note containing further details as we get closer to their concert date)

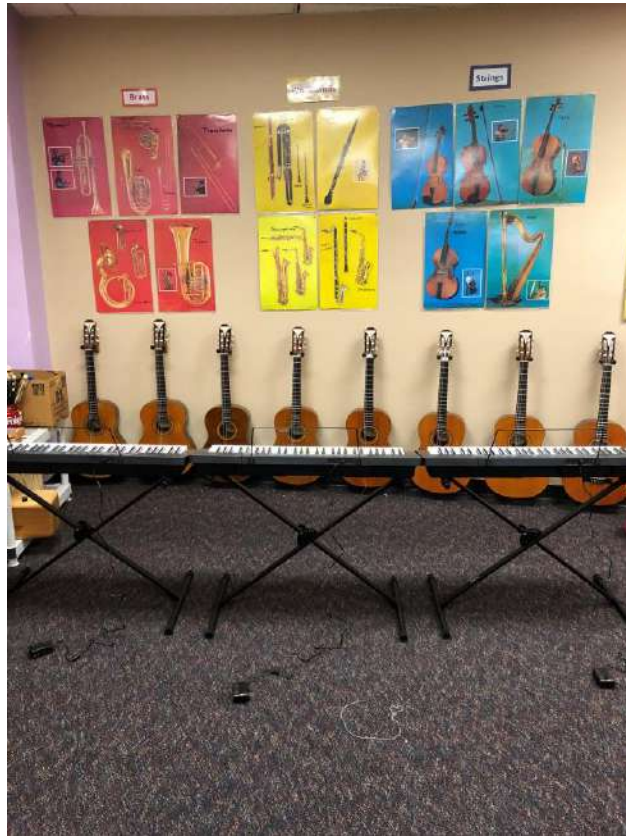
All concerts will start at 6pm in the cafeteria unless noted otherwise

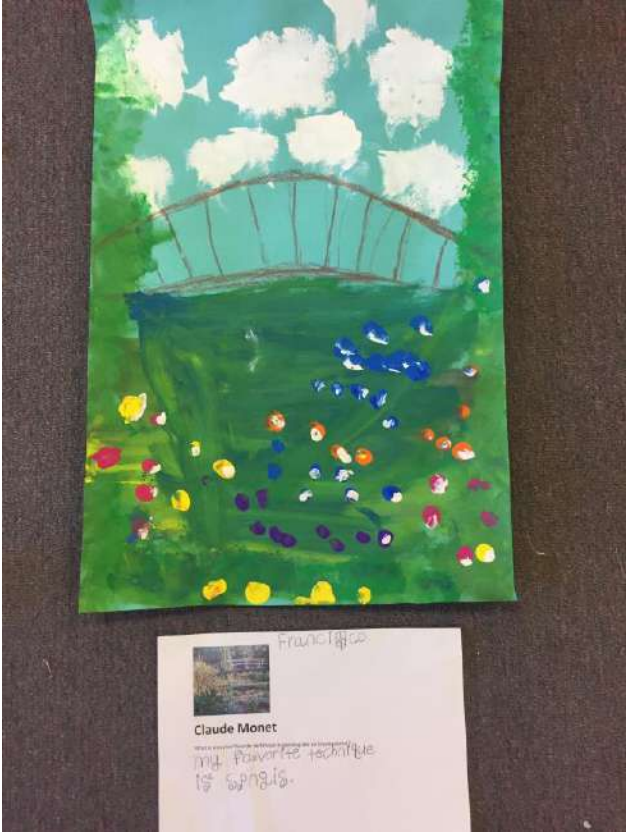

IMMUNIZATIONS

Reminder for 5th grade parents, Your son or daughter will need to get their Tdap immunization before entering middle school. Proof will be required by the first day of 6th grade.

The Tdap is a 3-in-1 immunization and booster that consists of diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (whooping cough). As you know these are serious diseases that can be life threatening. If you plan on going to the Mesa County Health Dept. call ahead at 970-248-6900 to schedule, as they often book up fast.

MEDICATIONS

If your child has any medications in the health office please be prepared to come in and sign them out by the last day of school. This includes as needed medications as well as Inhalers and Epi-Pens. Any and all medications left behind will be discarded on Friday, May 25th.

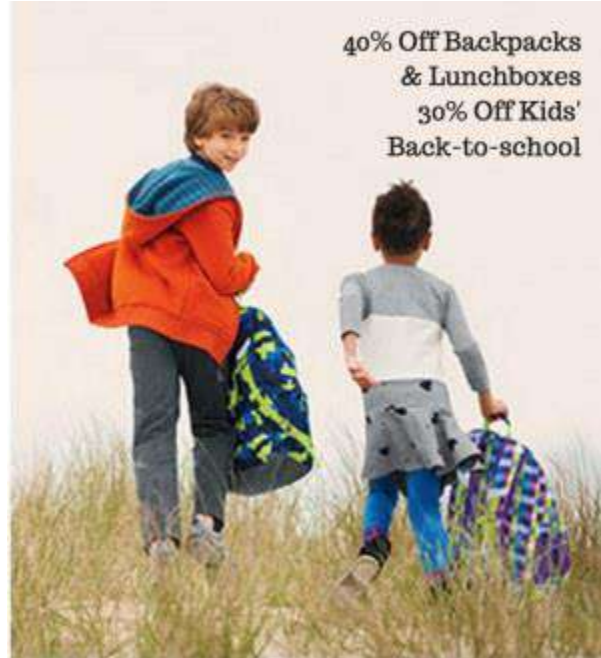
