Transportation Defined

• Under the provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Education of Improvement Act of 2004 (IDEA 2004), related services are defined as supportive services that assists a student with a disability to benefit from special education. Transportation as a related service includes travel to and from schools and between schools, travel in and around school buildings, and specialized equipment (such as special or adapted buses, lifts and, ramps) if required to provide special transportation for a student with a disability. (Reference: 34 CFR 300.34)

Transportation LRE Continuum

- No Transportation
 - For special education students, transportation services are no different then what is provided for nondisabled students who require busing to attend school due to the geographic location of their home.
- Public Transportation
- Special Education Transportation
- Specialized/Medical Transportation
- Parent Transport with Reimbursement

Do you think every child with a disability is entitled to Transportation as a related service under IDEA?

NO! Getting to school is always a prerequisite to participating in and benefiting from educational programs at school.

- Transportation must be included as a related service if students disability causes "unique need" for transportation.
- Needs can include;
 - Medical needs
 - Accessibility of curbs, sidewalks, etc.
 - Age of student
 - Cognitive ability, Adaptive behavior, and/or Communication skills
 - Behavior plans during transport
 - Distance/duration of ride

IEP team discussion on Transportation

- Is the Specialized Program offered at students' home school?
 - YES- if specialized program is provided at student's home school, and the IEP team did not determine a "unique need," transportation will NOT be offered through the IEP.
 - NO-if specialized program is not provided at student's home school, the IEP team can discuss transportation as a related service per student's individual need.


