

Griswold Board of Education Meeting Highlights (4/14/14)

- The following dates were confirmed by the Board:
 - GMS Grade 8 Promotion will be held on Thursday, June 19 at 6:00 PM.
 - GPS The Last Day of School for Students (Half Day) will be Friday, June 20.
 - GHS Graduation for the Class of 2014 will be held on Saturday morning, June 21 at 10:00 AM.
 - GPS The Last day of School for Teachers will be Tuesday, June 24.
- The Board reviewed a new policy presented by the Policy Subcommittee: #45118.51 Social Networking. This policy provides guidelines to employees of the Griswold Public Schools in the use of social networks, texting, and e-mail where students are or could be involved.
- The Board approved the annual Resolution for Schools and Libraries Universal Services (e-Rate) for 2014-15. By approving this resolution the school system receives funding for phones, internet, and website.
- The Board accepted a gift from the GES PTO in support of the IDOLS program.
- The Board received information about the GHS Roof Project, which included details of a walkthrough by potential bidders on the project 11 potential contractors were on site for the walkthrough. The bid opening is April 24 and will be reviewed by the town prior to a special meeting of the Building Committee on April 30.
- The Board reviewed tuition paid for students who attend magnet schools. The number of magnet schools continues to increase and as it does the district's tuition payments to magnet school increases. In 2014-15, \$88,066 was paid for regular education students to attend magnet programs, double what the figure was in 2012-13. The Board directed the Superintendent to send a letter to the Commissioner in support of a moratorium on additional magnet schools.
- The Board reviewed the process for selecting the next Assistant Principal at GMS.

Thoughts



At the April 15 meeting of the Griswold Board of Finance, the Board of Education budget was reduced by \$85,000. In order to make these cuts, the Board of Education will need to prioritize items in the Green Tier of the Budget (see below) and eliminate a majority of these important educational enhancements or reduce other supplies, equipment, and instructional materials.

As a result of the cuts, the current Town and School Budget increase represents a 1.23 mill increase, the same mill increase approved by voters in 2013. While that seems a positive number with which to move forward, the cuts to the Board of Education will have impact on programming for 2014-15.

The students in Griswold are going to lose new teachers and new programs that have been asked for by our staff and our parents. They will also lose supplies, equipment, and essential instructional materials.

The Board of Education worked in a serious manner to <u>review every request</u> over four months and trimmed the budget from an initial increase of 2.99% in January down to 2.39% in February and down to 2.29% in March.

As of April, the Board of Finance has cut the budget an additional \$85,000 bringing the increase down to 1.95%.

Our children cannot lose more.

Green Tier Budget Highlights Items that were originally included in the 2014-15 Budget

The items below were included in the original 2014-15 Budget developed by the Board of Education.

The funding for these items was requested by Principals and program leaders during the budget process. They were suggested by department heads, teachers, staff, parents, and community members.

As of April 15, the Board of Education Budget was reduced from an increase of \$576,450 (2.29% increase) to an increase of \$491,450 (1.95% increase).

The Griswold Board of Education will need to reduce \$85,000 from the 2014-15 Budget.

The reductions will come from new items listed below

and/or supplies, equipment, and instructional materials.

Building Program	Description	Cost
GES	Add 1.0 FTE Third Grade Teacher at Griswold Elementary School	\$ 42,000.00
Staffing	There are currently 143 students in Grade 2 in 7 sections ranging from 19-21 students per section. This teacher will be needed for the foreseeable future as there will continue to be seven sections.	
GPS	Add 210 1 12 Math meet childhold quality could be childhold	
Staffing	Currently, there is no Math Intervention in the Griswold Public Schools. The number of students scoring at the "goal" level in mathematics in grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, & 8 in 2012-2013 decreased.	
GMS	Increase 0.2 FTE String Teacher at Griswold Middle School	\$ 8,000.00
Staffing	In 2013-14 a 1.0 FTE music position that had been eliminated in 2012-13 was reinstated as a 0.5 FTE position. With strings being returned in Grade 5 and 6, the goal is to increase the position by .2 to allow the program to move forward and include grade 7 - in addition to 5 and 6.	
GHS	Increase in Athletic Trainer Services and Coverage at Griswold High School	\$ 3,000.00
Staffing	An athletic trainer provides safe practice settings for athletic teams by examining students with injuries and working with students and coaches to prevent injuries. The trainer monitors students with injuries guarding against further injury or strains.	
GHS	Plato Software (Licenses) at Griswold High School	\$ 7,500.00
Common Core	Plato Software plays an important role in providing students and teachers with a variety of resources including: dropout prevention, diagnostic assessment, personalized learning, and credit recovery.	
	Total of Green Tier Items	\$102,500.00

Even though this will result in a large cut from these items and other budget areas, it is important to support the budget at the May 13 Budget Referendum to avoid additional cuts.

The Board of Education will have a special meeting on Monday, April 21 at 6:00 PM in the GMS Library, which will be an additional budget workshop. This is an open meeting of the Board of Education and the public is welcome to attend.
