Course Description and Objectives	This survey course of German will involve listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills involving familiar topics. Students will understand and respond to simple expressions. They will speak and write using learned vocabulary in this introduction to the German language and culture that they will explore during the survey. A minimum of one survey of world language class is required for all sixth grade students.
Course Outline	9 Week Plan *Subject to Change Unit 1: Introductions, likes/dislikes, sports, hobbies, school and classroom procedures Unit 2: Colors, numbers, animals, clothing, classroom items and commands, family members Unit 3: Expressing feelings, German songs, labeling common objects Unit 4: Activities, events, holidays, celebrations, children's poetry, rhymes, and table manners Unit 5: Transportation, planets, telling time Unit 6: Cognates (words that look or sound the same), formal/informal language, comparing sound systems Unit 7: Common gestures, comparing food, clothing, toys, stories, and behavior patterns Unit 8: Restaurants, grocery stores, and weekly markets Unit 9: German politics and government, geography of German-speaking countries Unit 10: Culture Project Week (will be combined with week 9 if needed)
Classroom Expectations	 Be on time and in class daily. Be prepared with your supplies. Be alert and active in class activities. Listen quietly and respectfully when others are talking or during instruction. Respect your surroundings, classmates, and teacher. Keep your hands to yourself! Be open to trying new things and stepping outside of your comfort zone. We all make mistakes - me too! Focus on what you can do instead of what you cannot do in Germanyou are a beginner, and perfect performance in German is neither expected nor required. Obey all rules and policies stated in the Student Handbook.

Make-up Work/Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within three days of returning to school. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can get with a classmate or ask the teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests). Many times, missed quizzes and tests can be made up during school.
Statement on use of translators	Use of an online translator (e.g. Google Translate) is considered <u>academic dishonesty and plagiarism</u> . The assignment will receive a zero, and the student will be required to redo the assignment to show his/her own work. Multiple infractions will result in parent contact and office referral. Copying another student's work will also be treated as academic dishonesty and plagiarism for all students involved. Perfect language is not the goal, nor is it expected in this course. We want to see YOUR work only.
