The 1st Permanent Colony in America

Early America 100

Jamestown, 1607

The theory that a nation could increase its wealth through a favorable balance of trade by establishing colonies.

Early America 200

Mercantilism

He argued that rulers have the authority to enforce the law only for public good.

John Locke
