Chatham County Requires an additional 6 Electives

NC HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

TO BE PROMOTED TO THE 12TH GRADE, YOU MUST PASS 20 CLASSES BY THE END OF THIS YEAR. CHATHAM COUNTY SCHOOLS <u>DOES NOT</u> DO MIDSEMESTER PROMOTIONS.

EARLY GRADUATION/DISMISSAL

- EARLY GRADUATION IS FOR RISING SENIORS WHO HAVE NEVER FAILED A COURSE. YOU WILL TAKE FOUR CLASSES 1ST SEMESTER & NONE 2ND SEMESTER. YOU WILL NOT GET YOUR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA UNTIL JUNE. YOU MAY STILL PARTICIPATE IN THE PROM OR ANY OTHER SENIOR ACTIVITIES 2ND SEMESTER. IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO KEEP UP W/ INFO. GIVEN TO SENIORS.
- EARLY DISMISSAL IS FOR STUDENTS IN GOOD ACADEMIC STANDING. YOU MAY LEAVE AFTER 3RD BLOCK 2ND SEMESTER ONLY.
- YOU MUST COMPLETE AN EARLY GRADUATION/DISMISSAL FORM FROM MRS. KIVETT.
- NO STUDENTS WILL BE APPROVED FOR EARLY GRADUATION OR EARLY DISMISSAL UNTIL FINAL GRADES ARE REPORTED FROM YOUR JUNIOR YEAR IN JUNE. THEREFORE, ALL STUDENTS WILL REGISTER FOR 8 CLASSES.





NC HIGH SCHOOL TO COMMUNITY COLLEGE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

THE NC DEPT. OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AND THE NC COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM HAVE A STATEWIDE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT IN WHICH STUDENTS MAY BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE COLLEGE CREDIT AFTER COMPLETION OF IDENTIFIED CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) COURSES IN HIGH SCHOOL. THIS CREATES A SYSTEMATIC AND SEAMLESS PROCESS IN WHICH STUDENTS CAN MOVE FROM HIGH SCHOOL TO COMMUNITY COLLEGE WITHOUT HAVING TO DUPLICATE EFFORTS OR REPEAT COURSES.

CRITERIA TO AWARD ARTICULATION CREDIT FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGE CLASSES:

- GRADE OF B OR HIGHER IN THE COURSE, AND
- A SCORE OF 90 OR HIGHER ON THE STANDARDIZED CTE POST ASSESSMENT

IN OTHER WORDS, IF YOU MEET THE CRITERIA LISTED ABOVE IN SELECTED HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES, THEY CAN COUNT TOWARD YOUR COMMUNITY COLLEGE DEGREE.

- ENG 112 ARGUMENT-BASED RESEARCH COLLEGE CREDIT: 3 SEMESTER HOURS
- PREREQUISITE: ENG 111
- THIS COURSE, THE SECOND IN A SERIES OF TWO, INTRODUCES RESEARCH TECHNIQUES, DOCUMENTATION STYLES, AND ARGUMENTATIVE STRATEGIES. EMPHASIS IS PLACED ON HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENTS AND THEIR IMPACT ON THE MODERN WORLD THROUGH RELIGION, POLITICS, ECONOMICS, AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENTS. UPON COMPLETION, STUDENTS SHOULD BE ABLE TO COMPARE AND CONTRAST WESTERN AND NON-WESTERN CULTURES. THIS COURSE HAS BEEN APPROVED FOR TRANSFER UNDER THE CAA AND ICAA AS A GENERAL EDUCATION COURSE IN ENGLISH COMPOSITION.
