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## SCHOOL & COMMUNITY CHARACTERISTICS

Acalanes High School is located in Lafayette, California, a suburban community east of the Berkeley hills and approximately 25 miles from San Francisco. The Lafayette community values high-quality education and has a long history of strong community support offering financial resources through the Parents Club, Education Foundation and Booster Groups to enrich our school's academic and co-curricular programs.

Acalanes High School is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Acalanes Union High School District (AUHSD), which is known for its strong tradition of academic excellence and outstanding student performance. Acalanes enrolls approximately 1300 students grades 9 through 12. Our students are motivated and well prepared with 95% of seniors attending post-secondary institutions after graduation. Acalanes ranks in the top tier of all California high schools, is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and recognized as a California Distinguished School.

#### **ACADEMIC CURRICULUM**

Acalanes High School offers a strong college preparatory program. The school year consists of two 18-week semesters. Students can take up to 7 classes with the majority of upperclassmen enrolled in 6 periods per school day. Classes meet for 230 minutes per week in a modified block schedule. In addition to academically rigorous core courses, we offer a variety of technical skills classes as well as visual and performing arts.

Classes taken community college or other high schools or enrichment programs are not included in the transcript or GPA if the student is concurrently enrolled at Acalanes High School full-time.

2019-2020 and 2020-2021 Grading and Instruction AHS went to 100% distance learning in March 2020, for 50% of

the 2020 spring semester. **Spring 2020, All grades were credit/no credit.** 

**2020-2021** AHS was 100% distance learning until March 15 2021, when students had a choice to return in a hybrid format or stay in distance learning for 50% of spring 2021 semester. In 2020-2021, all students were given letter grades for all classes, both semesters.

In **August 2021**, in accordance with California AB 104, families were given the option of choosing to change any or all grades from 2020-2021 to pass/no pass. A grade of D- or higher could be changed to pass.

**2021-2022** AHS returned to fully in-person instruction.
