This booklet contains a list of local scholarships available to Seniors. You may apply for as many scholarships as you qualify for. Carefully read the criteria for applying for each scholarship. Please make sure you meet the qualifications listed in each scholarship for which you apply and have attached all the required elements. If a scholarship description says you MUST be something (member of club, certain ethnicity, etc.), that means exactly what it says – you MUST BE! If the description says "PRIORITY GIVEN TO", and you meet the other criteria listed, you can go ahead and apply. Scholarship sponsors do not like to review applications only to find the student wasn't even eligible to apply!

Remember! You are in competition with other students in your graduating class; in some instances, you are competing with students from HHS, HWHS, SPHS and other local schools. The committees will decide on the most accurate, complete, sincere, and neatest application. A well-written essay may decide the scholarship recipient. <u>Your attention to detail will reward you.</u>

We have made every attempt to ensure the accuracy of information in this booklet. The scholarships and criteria listed are based on donor participation from prior years. Availability and dollar amounts may change, but based on their participation in the past, the information remains the same for the most part. However, even though some scholarships listed have not been confirmed, we encourage you to apply for any that you qualify for. Although we make every effort to avoid any errors, occasionally an award amount or recipient may be listed/notified incorrectly (i.e. two students mistakenly chosen for the same award) the award will be split between the two recipients. If an award is listed incorrectly at a higher amount, the actual correct amount will be awarded. In any event, HJUHSD will not be responsible for any additional funds.

Some of the scholarships require their own special application (this is noted in individual descriptions). These applications have been converted to PDF files and can be downloaded from the Career Center website and SAVED on the student's computer. Rather than hand writing, or trying to line up the blanks in a typewriter, you simply hit the TAB key to move to each space to enter your information. Even if there is a later deadline date on the application, you should turn in all scholarships to the Career Center for submission to the organizations (unless otherwise stated in this booklet). In this way, we can verify that you have applied; otherwise you run the risk of your application not making it to the proper person.

If the description in this booklet does NOT state that there is a SPECIAL APPLICATION, that scholarship only requires the general HJUHSD Scholarship Application (also fill-in PDF). Most information on the general application is the same except for question #1 (name of scholarship). You can fill out a single HJUHSD application, print the application, then go back and change the scholarship name (and any other specific information) for different scholarships using the general application. Please be sure to type in the scholarship name accurately – it does not look professional to add the name in your handwriting or misspell the name. Included in this booklet, along with the scholarship listings is an essay reference guide. *An individually signed and dated essay must accompany each HJUHSD application.*

2018 HJUHSD Scholarship Essay

Your scholarship essay should be typed for it to receive careful consideration. You should carefully check your spelling, grammar, and accuracy of information. *Remember!* You are in competition with many others for these scholarships. *The only difference between you and your competitors is YOU!* Some scholarships have separate or additional essay requirements. If you have prepared your Scholarship essay according to these prompts, this will usually meet those requirements. In many cases, you may need to simply add specific additional information requested by the scholarship sponsor.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the essay is to persuade the scholarship committee that you are a candidate who should be highly considered. When beginning an autobiographical or narrative essay, the first point to keep in mind is that the reader is unfamiliar with you as an individual. Through your writing, the scholarship committee must be able to develop an understanding of your past and present accomplishments. Equally important are your educational and career goals, as well as your family's financial situation.

Many foundations or organizations will have specific topics that must be addressed in the essay. Be sure that these items are incorporated with relevant background information.

Typing your submitted essay is highly recommended for a professional appearance. Always remember you have just as much of a chance as the next person. A few hours of constructive work can reap up to \$1000, or more, in financial assistance.

Check spelling! (You cannot rely on "Spell Check" to catch all errors!)

It is best to have your essay no longer than two pages in length. Be concise and to the point. Longer essays are not recommended since the scholarship committees have many applications and essays to read. Try to engage the readers' interest from the very beginning... don't start your essay with "My name is ______."

The next column suggests an outline that should produce a concise and informative essay. Choose the suggestions that will pertain to the specific scholarship.

BE SPECIFIC

- 1. What makes you a unique individual... what sets you apart? If you were sitting in front of a scholarship panel and were asked "Tell us about yourself", how would you answer?
- Clearly indicate your reasons for choosing a particular major and profession. Include what experiences you already have had to influence these goals. If your major is undecided at this time, focus on reasons for entering college and efforts toward strengthening your academic background.
- You might describe specific high school or college courses, instructors, or counselors that have inspired your educational and career choices.
- 4. Take the opportunity to correlate your academic background with your extracurricular experiences (part-time work positions, school or community participation, etc.) to show how they unite to make you special.
- 5. Explain how the scholarship will assist in achieving your educational and professional goals. Clearly show your financial need if this requirement is specified. Be specific about what finances you will be able to contribute to your college education.
- Explain any special circumstances, such as hardships or exceptional family or other special circumstances that may affect you going to college.

REMEMBER:

Individually sign and date your essays.

Failure to do so may disqualify your application!

The Personal Statement - A Guide for Students

The following is taken from an article distributed by University California at Berkeley on writing personal statements.

Why is a personal statement important?

The purpose of the personal statement is to give you an opportunity to tell us important things about yourself that are not addressed or apparent in the application. In making decisions about scholarships, we want to consider your personal attributes and gain some sense of who you are; your experiences, accomplishments, and a variety of qualities such as motivation, self-discipline, leadership, commitment to others, your intended field of study and your career goals as well as your academic record.

Each year, the scholarship sponsors receive applications from many more students than they can award, and the academic records of these students are usually very similar. In order to discover and evaluate the distinctions among these applicants, scholarship selection committees look closely at an individual's entire application. The academic record, information about accomplishments and activities, and personal statements help us gain insight into a student's level of achievement and character. In some cases, the personal statement can be a critical factor in the selection process.

Mechanics of Writing the Personal Statement

Carefully read the instructions printed in the applications, especially the instructions for personal statements. A common mistake applicants make is to skim the instructions contained in the application and rely on information received from others. Take time to read and understand all the instructions so your application is a true and complete reflection of you.

You are expected you to write the personal statement yourself; write in your own voice. At the same time, it is probably wise to have a friend, teacher, or parent read the statement to advise you on how well it conveys what you want it to say, and if it reflects who you really are. Remember: the purpose of the personal statement is to help selection committees know you on a personal level. Recognize both the importance of the personal statement and the difficulty of the task. The statement is not something that should be scribbled just before you send your application. Give yourself enough time to produce a thoughtful and carefully composed personal statement.

What does the University Look for in the Personal Statement?

Your personal statement needs to clearly convey what you think is important to know about you. In reading your statement, sponsors look for personal characteristics that include creativity, intellectual curiosity and achievement, personal initiative, motivation, leadership, persistence, exceptional recognition and rare talent, the ability to overcome hardship and get along with others, and service to others. In any case, your statement should clearly convey what you think is important fort them to know about you and convey a sense of a full human being behind the GPA and test scores. If you are applying to a specific major, you should discuss your interest in your intended field of study.

What is a good Personal Statement?

There is no single good personal statement. However, successful statements tend to be those that reveal the individuality and appeal of the applicant. Remember that your application will be compared to those of other competitive students, many of whom have shared similar experiences such as activities in student government, travel to other countries, participation in sports, and volunteer activities. Your approach in expressing yourself may be an important factor. What sponsors want to learn about you is how the activity, job, or experience you write about has changed your attitude, solidified a belief, established a goal, sharpened a perception, or heightened an appreciation. They look for definitions of your values and goals, and how they have been demonstrated in your life. They look for meaningful participation, not just a listing of activities.

What the Personal Statement is not

The personal statement should not be a sample of writing skills, although it is assumed that your presentation will be grammatically correct. It should not be a chronicle of events or an autobiography. The statement is about you, not about events. Your personal statement should not be predictable and one-dimensional. A statement that tells facts only and never mentions changes in you doesn't add to our understanding of who you are. In deciding what to write about, it is not the subject which is critical. What is important is what you learned, how your sense of direction was solidified, how your image of yourself or others changed, and so on.

ACSA - KINGS CHARTER SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018 Number Varies - \$500

Applicant must be a graduating senior of a public high school and must attend an accredited community college or institute of higher learning. Applicant must be a son/daughter of current member of Kings Charter, ACSA. Minimum GPA - 3.0. In-school and out-of-school participation in leadership and community activities will be considered. The ACSA Regional scholarship has a special application that parents should receive from ACSA.

ADVENTIST HEALTH MEDICAL CENTER VOLUNTEER SERVICE LEAGUE SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018 Number Varies - \$2,000

Must plan a career in medicine or a related field. Scholarship, community involvement, and school activities are very important. Financial need, work experience, volunteer service and special circumstances will also be considered. Minimum 3.0 GPA; requires two letters of recommendation, transcript, and one-page typed essay describing the desire and ability to succeed, realistic goals for future, and should include description of work and volunteer experience. Use the HJUHSD scholarship application, but you MUST KEEP YOUR ESSAY TO ONE PAGE (may be single spaced)!

BARBARA SHARP-PORTERFIELD SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018 Number & Amount Varies

Mrs. Porterfield, a graduate of Hanford High School and a former teacher at Roosevelt Elementary School has established this scholarship for graduates of Roosevelt. Applicants must be a graduate of Roosevelt Elementary School and plan to attend a two- or four-year school after graduation. Must have been academically successful in high school. Scholarship will go to one female and one male student.

BILL DUNN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018 1- Amount Varies

Bill Dunn was born in Hanford in 1933 and graduated from HUHS, as did his mother and four children. He was from a pioneer Hanford family. Bill practiced law in the community and served as a Justice Court Judge before his death in 1978. His primary interest was in helping the disadvantaged and he always did pro bono work. Several of his friends and associates established this memorial scholarship in his name. Minimum GPA of 3.5. Plan to major in Law or Pre-Law and plan a prospective career in law or political science. Consideration will also be given to financial need and school activities.

BRAZIL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: *January* 25, 2018 **2 - \$300**

Applicants must have been active for three years in FFA and planning to major in Agriculture. Must show leadership potential and have a high scholastic aptitude. Financial need will be considered.

BUSH CONSTRUCTION SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: *January* 25, 2018 **3 - \$500**

Preference given to applicant who is planning to major in Construction Management, Civil Engineering or Architecture at a four-year college or trade school. Financial need will be considered.

CENTRAL CALIFORNIA INDEPENDENT GROCERS SCHOLARSHIP HWHS & HHS ONLY

Deadline: *January 25, 2018* **2 - \$500**

Grades, financial need and school activities are important. One male and one female will be selected.

DAVID DIAS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: *January* 25, 2018 **1 - \$100**

Applicant must have been active for three years in FFA and planning a career in Agriculture. Must show leadership potential and have a high scholastic aptitude. Financial need will be considered.

DEREK WILLIAMS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

1 - \$250

This scholarship is in memory of Derek Williams, a Hanford High graduate who died at age 19 in a tragic car accident. Derek played water polo all four years at Hanford High. He was awarded MVP of the Junior Varsity team as a sophomore. As a Junior, he was a starting player on the Valley Championship winning team. Applicants must be a Hanford High boys water polo player with a GPA of at least 2.0. Preference will be given to players who plan to play water polo at the college level. The applicants will be reviewed by the Williams family.

EMILE J. LA SALLE SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

2 - \$1,000

This scholarship is to honor Mr. Emile LaSalle for the impact that he had on the futures of hundreds of FFA students over his long career at HHS. One former student stated that he "would probably have dropped out of school and secured a job (as did my two older brothers) if Mr. LaSalle had not instilled such strong values of accomplishment that directly influenced my life. With his heavy emphasis of competing and winning in FFA judging contests, he instilled confidence and self worth in us to make us believe the we WERE special and that we COULD compete with anyone in life's endeavors. He is so special to us that this scholarship is but a token of our appreciation for all that he has given us." The primary basis for granting this scholarship is participation and success in FFA Judging teams and FFA activities. Applicants are judged with a weighted index that considers 70% emphasis on judging contest participation and success, 20% on other FFA activities, 5% on other high school activities, and 5% on the student's character (based on the essay written by these applicants). Sponsors want to see a very detailed list of all FFA judging activities over their four years, not just summaries. Applicants should be planning a career in Agriculture; planning to major in Agriculture Science. Minimum GPA of 3.0. Other school activities will also be considered. Financial need is NOT a consideration.

GAYLE YOCUM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP SPHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

1 - \$2,000

Gayle Richards was born in Minnesota in 1939. Her family immigrated to Southern California in 1952. After junior college, a job took her to Lemoore where she met Ray Yocum, a local farmer. The couple married in 1961. Gayle quit work to raise the couple's children. Her hobbies included tennis and skiing, and she was active in the PTA and local 4-H Club. Gayle was also a valued member of many philanthropic groups. She was outgoing, friendly and rarely said "No" when asked for help. This scholarship was established in 1989 in memory of this talented, energetic, and much-loved woman. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher and attend a four-year college. Financial need, grades and school activities will also be considered.

GIL DAUDISTEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number & Amount Varies

This scholarship is in memory of Gil Daudistel who taught several subjects within the history department at Hanford High School from 1967 until his retirement in 1995. He was an enthusiastic scholar who loved history and the teaching of history. Applicant must be planning to major in Social Science or History and have at least 2.75 overall GPA. Financial need and school activities will also be considered. Priority will be given, but not limited to, a student entering a Christian college.

GRANGEVILLE 4-H CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

1 or more - \$250

Applicant must have participated in Grangeville 4-H during high school, be a Junior Leader and an active member of the club. Minimum GPA of 2.0. Plan to attend an accredited college or trade school. Consideration will be given to financial need.

H.O.P.E. (Helping Other People Everywhere) FOR STUDENTS SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

1 - \$500

H.O.P.E. is an international organization designed to help people. They specialize in education, and in putting willing donors in touch with those they could help. They never profit financially when they provide or share blessings. Criteria includes good grades, positive attitude and public/community service. This scholarship is renewable for at least one year - depending on student's freshman (college) grades. Use the general HJUHSD Scholarship Application, but you must add an essay explaining in 100-250 words how helping people is good for both donors and recipients.

HADLEY YOCUM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

1 - \$2.000

Hadley was born in 1901 in Arkansas. He immigrated to Hanford from Oklahoma during the Dust Bowl. He started as a sharecropper, and with hard work, determination and strapping young sons he was able to purchase land of his own. HL Yocum & Sons grew to become a large and well respected farming operation in the Lakeside community. Hadley was friendly and well-liked. This scholarship was established in 1989 to honor Hadley and his extraordinary agricultural legacy. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher, attend a four-year college, and plan to major in the field of Agriculture. Financial need, grades and school activities will also be considered.

HANFORD BREAKFAST LIONS CLUB - "ACE" AVEDISIAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP SPHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number Varies - \$500

Preference will be given to students who plan to pursue a career in Optometry or major in the field of Medical Science. Minimum GPA of 3.0. Consideration will be given to community service, extracurricular activities, and grades; financial need is very important. If you are a good student -- Apply! THIS SCHOLARSHIP IS FOR SPHS SENIORS ONLY!!!

HANFORD BREAKFAST LIONS CLUB - BOB DE REMER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

HHS &HWHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

4 - \$500

Preference will be given to students who plan to pursue a career in Optometry or major in the field of Medical Science. Minimum GPA of 3.0. Consideration will be given to community service, extracurricular activities, and grades. Financial need is very important. If you are a good student -- apply! THIS SCHOLARSHIP IS ONLY FOR HHS & HWHS SENIORS!!

HANFORD CHAMBER OF COMMERCE SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

3 - \$250

Priority given to students planning to major in Business. Grades, financial need and school activities are important.

HANFORD ELEMENTARY CSEA #344 SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

4 or more - \$250

Must have a parent or relative that is a CSEA member in Kings County. Scholarship, financial need and school activities will be considered.

HANFORD EMBLEM CLUB No. 290 SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number & Amount Varies

Priority will be given to a student who has a relative who is affiliated with the Emblem Club. Consideration will be given to a student who plans to major in an area working with hearing impaired or other physically challenged individuals. Grades, financial need and school activities will also be considered.

HANFORD GARDEN CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

3 - \$500

Must be planning a career related to the objectives of the Hanford Garden Club. This may include: botany, conservation, entomology, floriculture, forestry, horticulture, landscape architecture, plant biology and/or plant genetics, urban planning, agriculture or research in allied fields. Consideration will be given to grades, extracurricular activities, and financial need. School transcript is required, along with three letters of recommendation which discuss scholastic ability, personal character, and work related experiences of applicant (each letter limited to one page).

HANFORD MASONIC LODGE #279 SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

2 - \$1.000

Student can be planning to attend any college, vocational program or trade school. Minimum GPA of 2.5 and must be a U.S. citizen. Financial need is important. Having a relative in the Masonic family is given special consideration.

HANFORD NOON KIWANIS CLUB - GERRY VAN SOLEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number & Amount Varies

Minimum GPA of 3.2. Community service involvement and financial need will also be considered. Having a Kiwanian as a family member (not just of Hanford Noon Kiwanis) is a first consideration, but not a requirement.

HANFORD ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018 Number & Amount Varies

Minimum 3.5 GPA and demonstrate financial need. Requires an essay (1-2 pages max) about the Rotary 4 Way Test. Rotary is an International Service Club dedicated to building goodwill and understanding. There are no "right or wrong" ways to approach this essay. Any Rotary activities such as Camp Royal/Interact Club or school clubs, any work with the Salvation Army or your local church should be included in your resume. Students may be interviewed by selected Rotary members. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

HANFORD SECONDARY EDUCATORS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number & Amount Varies

Priority will be given to the son or daughter of a member of the Hanford Secondary Educators Association. Minimum GPA of 2.5. Preference will be given to, but not limited to, those who plan to major in the field of Education. Financial need and school activities will be considered. All students are encouraged to apply.

HANFORD SONS OF ITALY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number Varies - \$500

Must be an active member or junior member of Hanford Sons of Italy for at least four years and plan to attend a two- or four-year college. Minimum GPA of 3.0. Must have participated in various school, club, or community activities; must have participated in Sons of Italy fundraising projects. Some consideration will be given to financial need. Must submit one essay entitled "What my Italian heritage means to me" and one 300-word maximum essay on why the applicant should receive this award. (Use the HJUHSD application and add the specific essay). A copy of your transcript is acceptable.

HHS AQUATICS BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number Varies - \$100

Applicants must have participated in one or more aquatic sports at Hanford High School for at least three years, with one of those years being their senior year. Minimum GPA of 2.0. Grades and other school activities will also be considered.

HHS BAND BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

1 - \$500

Requires a minimum of two years in Band or Colorguard, good academic standing, outstanding morale and positive attitude.

HHS CHORAL MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

2 - \$200

This scholarship is for any choir student wishing to pursue a college major or minor in music.

HHS CSF SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number & Amount Varies

Must be an active CSF member. Minimum GPA of 3.3. Selections will be based on scholarship, club involvement, with priority going to those who have held offices. Extracurricular activities and financial need will also be considered.

HHS DRAMA CLUB SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

1- \$300

Must be planning a career in the arts and have participated in school plays. Grades are also very important. Financial need and school activities will be considered.

HHS LADY RUNNIN' PUPS BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number Varies - up to \$1,000

Applicant must participate three years in the Hanford High School Ladypups basketball program and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Student and their parent/sponsor must participate in two eligible fundraising events per year. Must submit an essay describing what basketball has done for their lives and future goals. This scholarship was started by the Boosters Club to help the girls reach their goals.

HHS QUARTERBACK CLUB SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018 Number & Amount Varies

Applicants must have a 2.50 GPA and have participated in Hanford High football for three years, with at least one year at Varsity level. You must submit a one- to two-page essay telling why playing football at HHS was important to you, along with background information, educational plans and financial need. Extracurricular activities and grades will also be considered.

HHS SIXTH MAN BOOSTERS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP HHS ONLY!!

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number and Amount Varies

Must have a GPA of 2.8 or better and have participated for three years in the HHS Boys' Basketball program - excluding transfers, scorekeepers, managers, etc. who are eligible. Financial need is very important. Grades and school activities will also be considered.

HJUHSD ADMINISTRATORS SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number & Amount Varies

Priority given to a child, dependent or relative of a current Hanford Joint Union High School District Administrator. Minimum GPA of 3.5. Consideration will be given to grades, financial need, and school activities.

HJUHSD CSEA #461 SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: January 25, 2018

Number & Amount VarieS

Wes felt the call to work with students so in 1954 they moved with their children to Fresno to finish his degree – interrupted by the War. In 1956 he began teaching 5th grade at Roosevelt Elementary. Teaching was a perfect fit for him. Using his musical skills, creative talents, sense of humor and love of students, he helped his students believe in themselves while increasing their competencies for life. At Jefferson a few years later, he started his first choir. With his niece and nephew at the school, he acquired the nickname "Uncle Wes", which stuck with him throughout his career. Over the years he also started boy's choir at Woodrow Wilson and went on to the HHS music program. Students flocked to be in his programs, and Uncle Wes became an influencer in student's lives. He had 7 choirs; at one point there were over 500 students in choirs. Once their own children got older, Dorothy went back to teaching, starting choirs where she taught. She was well known for holding school musicals and strongly believed that music should be incorporated into the curriculum so every child could participate at some level. After a heart attack in 1980, Wes gave up the choirs and taught Math and English. He retired in 1984, but continued to work in Dorothy's class at Jefferson as her aide, teaching English at C.O.S and going to work at Walmart as a Greeter. He loved greeting former students. Dorothy retired in 1991. While the couple received many accolades during their teaching careers, their most valued were the letters from students thanking them for their influence and love. Continuing to receive letters until shortly before their deaths, they saved them all as mementos of all their "children". Dorothy passed away in 1999 and Wesley died in July 2006. They will be remembered for the love, joy and music they brought to everyone's life. Their family felt the best way to honor them was a scholarship for a student involved in music. Requires a minimum 3.0 GPA, student must have been in band or chorus at least one year during high school and must write a short essay about "How music has changed my life" or "The importance of music in my life".

HAVE YOU INDIVIDUALLY SIGNED AND DATED EACH OF YOUR ESSAYS?
Have you alphabetized your applications by scholarship name?
Have you STAPLED all attachments to your application?
Although not always required, if you have a very nice letter of recommendation (or two), you may wish to enhance your chances by attaching copies of these letters to your application. If possible, having them addressed to "Dear Scholarship Committee" is preferred.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

In most instances, you must be enrolled in college full-time to collect the funds and must provide Proof of Enrollment. In that event, scholarships will not be paid unless you are carrying a minimum of 12 units.
