## PRINCIPAL’S MESSAGE

### Dear Vinci Park Families:

Spring has arrived. The weather is becoming warmer as we approach the end of this school year. We have begun our planning process for the 2010-11 school year. Last month, an **“Intent to Return”** form was sent home in the Wednesday envelope. Please complete the form and return it to our school office as soon as possible. If you have questions about class placement for your child for the next school year, I have included in this newsletter our **“Class Placement”** school policy for your information. Please take a few minutes to read it. I hope it will clarify some of the questions you may have regarding class placement for your child next year.

More importantly, for two weeks beginning April 26<sup>th</sup>, students in the 2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grades will take part in the State mandated Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) Program. All students in grades two through five will take the California Standards Tests (CSTs). These tests measure how well students are learning the California content standards for each subject area tested. Results of the STAR Program tests provide valuable information about the academic achievement of all students. We need your help to ensure that your child arrives at school on time, especially during the two weeks of state testing. On testing days, make sure your child attends school, gets a good night’s rest, and has a healthy breakfast before coming to school. Your support is very important in ensuring that your child do their best.

Finally, we want to inform you that last weekend our school was hit very heavy with graffiti & vandalism. This has been occurring all year, but not the level of damages over the weekend. We are working closely with our school facilities department and the San Jose Police Department to address this growing issue and deter them from happening again. And we are also asking for our community’s help, especially our neighbors, to report any suspicious activities during non-school hours (evenings and weekends) to the SJPd as soon as possible. Your support and assistance will help alleviate the crime that is taking place in our school community. The non-emergency SJPd number is 311 or 277-8000.

Thank you for your continued support of Vinci Park.

## **CLASS PLACEMENT POLICY**

As professional educators, we take great effort in the development of our class rosters. We take into account the needs of individual children and the ways they relate to various teacher styles. We know which children work well together and those that do not. Each class is balanced as much as possible with an equal number of boys and girls with a range of academic ability levels. We are careful not to place too many children with behavioral challenges in a single classroom. We consider the best learning situation for all of our children and we make these decisions very carefully. The principal, along with teachers' input, makes classroom assignments. The following guidelines are used:

- Classes are balanced in terms of gender, abilities and behavior.
- Students in special programs, such as RSP/SDC or ELD, may be clustered to maximize in class support from resource teachers and/or instructional aides.
- Parents are encouraged to visit classrooms at Open House to become familiar with what is happening in the classrooms. Observation in individual classrooms during instructional time is discouraged, and will occur only after meeting with the principal.
- COMBO CLASSES – Why do we have combination classes? Multi-grade classrooms, otherwise known as combination classrooms, are formed out of necessity. Often, student enrollment in residential public schools does not always fit into the scheme of having straight classes. Every year, we do our very best to fill classes based on projections and past year experience to create the best scenario for our students. It doesn't always work. This common scenario and budget constraints requires us to create combination classes. When this happens, we apply the same placement process as we would for putting together a straight class.
- All classroom assignments will be posted in the school window after 4:00 PM on the Friday before school starts in the fall.

Monica's despair and isolation are realistically portrayed and highlight the often-overlooked aggression between females. The child eventually shares her anguish with her mother, who effectively counsels her without presenting any pat solutions or easy answers. ### **HOW YOU CAN HELP YOUR CHILD PREPARE FOR THE TESTING**

The role you play to help your child to be successful is very important. You can help your children prepare adequately for the tests by doing several things to provide support and encouragement and create a positive test-taking experience.

- See that your child gets a full night's sleep every night during the testing weeks.
- Make sure that your child eats a good breakfast on the day of the test. Hunger can detract from a good test performance.
- Make sure that your child is in school during the testing sessions. Do not plan any vacation leave, doctor or dental appointments on test dates.
- Get your child up early enough to arrive at school on time without rushing.
- Have your child dress in something he or she likes so that he/she feels confident and comfortable.
- Be positive when you send your child to school. Acknowledge that the tests are difficult, but encourage your child to do his or her best.



Encourage your child to listen carefully to all test-taking directions given by the teacher and to ask questions about those directions that are not clear.

### **EARTH DAY-VINCI PARK TREE PLANTING DAY**

On April 22<sup>nd</sup>, Vinci students, teachers, staff, and volunteers from Intel will be helping to plant 44 trees around our school campus grounds. We are currently working with the SJ City Forest and our district facilities department on the details of the day and we need your help to make it a meaningful and successful event for our community. If you can come out and spare a few hours with your gardening skills, it will make a huge difference.

Here's what it may look like for the day –

- the SJ City Forest will arrive about 30-45 minutes prior to the planting to distribute the trees, stakes, and set the hoses.
- start the planting at 9am with a 20- minute demonstration for everyone participating in planting to learn how to plant the trees. Volunteers will split everyone up into groups of 3 or 4 and assign them to a hole. Every 3 or 4 holes there will also be assigned an OCF Tree Amigo (trained volunteers) who will check-in with each planting group to ensure that each tree is planted to our standards. Depending on the number of people that we have participating, we can have everyone plant 1 or 2 trees.
- Each team will be responsible for watering and getting mulch from the truck for their own trees. After the trees are planted, we will have another crew stake the trees with 2 or 3 wood stakes. For this we could use about 10 strong and tall volunteers to help drive the posts in the ground.

As you can see, this is a large undertaking, so it would be really helpful for us to know approximately how many volunteers we can expect at least a week prior to the planting.

With sufficient volunteers we could get this project done in 3-4 hours. Typically they can get all the planting and mulching done by noon and then the staking crew takes a little more time to make sure every tree is securely staked.

Volunteers should expect to help dig holes and get their hands dirty when preparing the root ball for planting. All participating volunteers must wear closed-toed shoes. We recommend that all volunteers have proper sun protection (hats/glasses/sun screen), bring water bottles, and bring garden gloves, if they don't want to get their hands dirty. We will be planting rain or shine, so we encourage volunteers to bring rain gear, if necessary.

### **FIT FOR LEARNING**

#### **Consumer Beware**

Even though you now know how and why to eat healthily, why is it still so hard to make healthy choices? One reason is because you are constantly exposed to advertisements that tempt you to eat foods that may not be the best choice for your body. You see ads in the

newspaper, in magazines, on TV, on billboards and even on the food packages themselves. Companies will sometimes include a toy to get you to buy their products. Restaurants will let you play a game or super size an item for a few pennies more just to get you in the door. It is important for you to become an educated consumer so that you can start to see past these ads and make healthy purchases despite what companies would like you to do.

Many of the ads you see for unhealthy behaviors are shown on TV. Coincidentally, the last full week of April is National TV Turn-Off Week. It encourages everyone to turn off the TV for only seven days during the entire year. It is meant to provide people with an opportunity to take another step away from the constant barrage of advertisements. It is also a good opportunity for kids and adults to spend less time in front of the TV and discover more physically active things that could be done. Get off that couch and do something physically active instead of watching TV!

#### Ideas for Implementation:

1. Take note of how many times your family buys food or goes to a restaurant because of something that is being advertised.
2. Set up a competition between family members to design or come up with the best advertisement for a healthy food or activity. This could be done as a print ad or as a mock-TV ad.
3. As a family, participate in TV Turn-Off Week (the last week in April).
4. Make a list of things you can do instead of watching TV. Keep the list posted on the refrigerator or better yet, on the TV.
5. Make healthy choices despite advertisements that encourage you to do otherwise.
6. Find an alternative to watching TV during National TV Turn-Off Week – go for a walk, read a book, go to the park with your friends, play a game with your family.
