



HUMAN GROWTH, DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION POLICY

Any parent or legal guardian of a Waterbury Public School student may exempt his/her child from any or all lessons dealing with Human Growth, Development and Family Life portions of the Health and Wellness Education Curriculum. This may be done by **written notification** to the Principal of the building that the child attends. Copies of the curriculum are available at the school for parent review. If you would like to read the curriculum, please call the school and make an appointment to go in and review the material.

Costume Preparation Person

We are looking for a parent or community member who knows how to sew. The duties include fitting students for costumes, some ironing and general costume maintenance. Approximately 60 hours for the school year.

2013-2014 ATTENDANCE/TRUANCY UPDATES

- Parent notes are allowed for the first 9 absences, regardless of the reason
- For absences 5-10, referrals are made to our own school staff for internal counseling, and a PPT or 504 is scheduled *if necessary*
- If no legitimate reasons are still given between absences 5-10, then a referral is made to WYS (Waterbury Youth Services), after all other internal resources are exhausted
- For the 10th absence & each absence after, no more parent notes are allowed. A legitimate note has to be provided in order for the absence to be excused (this includes: funeral, death in family, educational, religious holiday, court appearance, doctor notes, or lack of transportation that is normally provided by another school district that the student is from)
- Students must be in class for at least ½ of the school day in order for it to count, otherwise if they come in late or leave early, and they're present hours are less than ½ of the school day, then that day is considered an ABSENCE
- For every 3 tardies/early dismissals, an absence is accumulated for the specific class affected by the tardy/dismissal
- Total absences allowed are now 20 days, not 18, but this INCLUDES both excused AND unexcused absences
- At 15 absences, if no legitimate reasons have been given for absences, a referral is made to our CRO (community resource officer) to make a call to the home
- AT 20 absences, a CRO (community resource officer) makes a HOME VISIT & if necessary, parents/guardians are fined \$25 per student absence & referred to court system
- At 20 days, a waiver (new term for appeal) is necessary, where the parent/guardian must request a waiver in writing within 5 days of receiving the loss of credit letter, and at that point, a waiver meeting is set up to decide if student will receive credit or not
