Another way to stay safe this Halloween season

Over one thousand people in the U. S. have died of H1N1, a.k.a the "Swine Flu". People between the ages of 6 month to 24 year olds are most susceptible to the infectious disease. Pregnant women are also highly at risk.

Fortunately, there are two solutions to preventing the flu; getting the swine flu shot or get a Live Attenuated Influenza Vaccine (LAIV) which is a nasal spray.

If you want to get the vaccine, though, you will have to wait because there is a shortage. In fact, vaccination clinics in Tucson have been postponed until further notice because there is no vaccine available.

According to experts, it is taking longer to grow the vaccine than thought, but a new batch is predicted

to arrive in Southern Arizona within the next few weeks.

Not everyone wants the shot, though, because they worry that it isn't well-tested enough.

"They just came out with a new vaccine and I don't trust it," said NHS student Alexa Rangel.

There have also been a few extremely rare and unusual side-effects. In recent news, there was a case about a 26 year old cheerleader that was just diagnosed with Dystonia. This is a disorder that causes the muscles to react and spasm involuntarily. It has not allowed this young woman to speak nor to walk forwards.

The weird thing about the effect the shot had on her is that only walking backwards or running lets her speak normally or get control of herself. She only gets the attack as soon as she walks

forward and that's when she loses all form of control while speaking and in her movements.

Nevertheless, most medical experts recommend getting the vaccine, especially for those in high risk groups and those working in the medical or care-giving profession.

This is one decision that will have to be made by each person; either choose one or the other.

By not getting the shot though, doesn't necessarily mean you will get swine flu, especially if one is healthy and is well taken care of.

If you choose not to get vaccinated this flu-season, there are other things you can do to avoid the virus, such as frequently washing your hands with soap and warm water and using sanitation gels. See our related story, *Avoiding the Swine Flu* on page 2.

Nogales High School students donate life-saving blood

Some students squirmed, others grimaced, but none passed out and most were all smiles after giving blood at the Red Cross Blood Drive, sponsored by the NHS Student Council on Oct. 20.

At the end of the day the Red Cross was able to collect over 40 usable pints of blood, which will go to help 123 patients right here in Arizona.

"Each blood donation is precious and we consider each donor to be a hero," said Red Cross Coordinator Carlos Apalategui.

Approximately 60 students signed up, although some of them were turned down for a variety of reasons, the most common of which was due to a new weight requirement. Many girls got turned away because they were too thin.

At the end of the day StuCo had 42 regular donors and two people who donated double pints. The effort was well worth it because even the superintendent donated blood.

"It was great to see the superintendent," said Student Council



Junior Daisy Vizcarra is happy to donate and said it didn't hurt much at all.

President Dari Trujillo. "What a way to set a good example for the students."

Donors must be at least 16 years of age, with parent permission, and be healthy. Boys must weigh a minimum of 110 pounds and girls weight varies depending on their height. The shorter the girl, the more she must weigh.

If you didn't get a chance to donate this fall don't worry, StuCo has scheduled another blood drive for this upcoming spring.

"It was great experience for the students at NHS and I can't wait until next year," said first time donor Manuel Munoz.

The fire department has set a goal to have the whole NHS student population certified in CPR in four years. They started with last year's freshmen (now sophomores) and it is planned to be conquered by the time the class of 2012 is ready to graduate.

All freshman P.E classes attended this training. These students learned a few different techniques on how to save a victim's life. At least try to anyway.

On Monday, October 19, students learned how to treat a victim that needs CPR. They were taught how to hold them down and how to breathe. Also they learned how to perform the Heimlich maneuver on a choking person.

On Wednesday, October 21, students learned how to use the AED machine. This machine gives electric shocks to bring a person back to life and gets

the heart running again.

"When you get the AED machine you press the button and it gives you directions, you have to place one patch on the heart and the other one on the side, then it shocks the person. It's fun," said freshman Idaly Balvastro.

On Friday, October 23, students learned how to perform CPR on an infant. They went over everything they had learned over the trainings. In about a month students will get their certificates.

"I am so proud of my students. The kids did very well and learned everything they needed to learn," said Mrs. Hernandez

After touring and promoting their previous album, *Decemberunderground*, AFI is back with their eighth studio album, *Crash Love*.

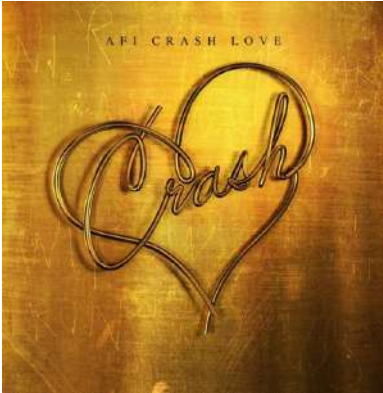

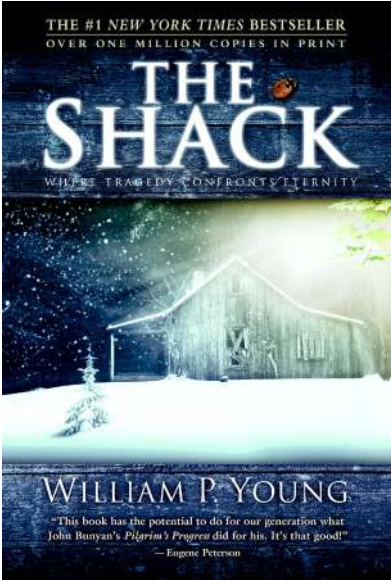

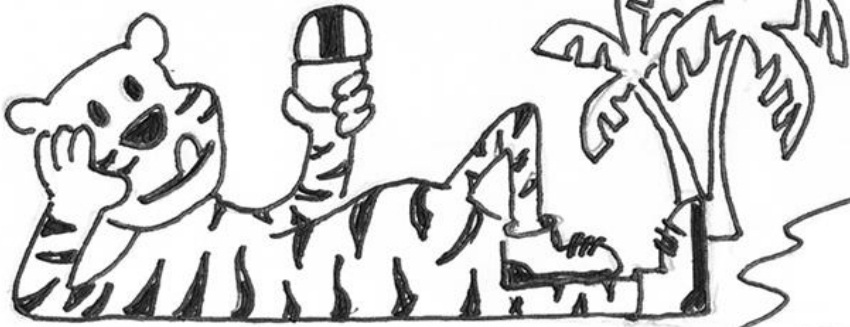
