

May 2021 Meeting Minutes

Date, Time, and Location: Tuesday, May 11, 2021 6:30 PM via Zoom

Meeting Start Time: 6:32 PM

**6:32 PM** Ashley M asked Angela M how much the PTO spent on Teacher Appreciation Week. Angela reported that \$45.84 was spent on snacks, and \$190 was spent on Kiefer's Kettle Korn. The budgeted amount increased to \$700 for this year. In the past it was \$500. Angela commented that the Amazon wishlist that families bought from realty helped.

5:34 PM Motion to approve April 2021 minutes: 1st-Becky Wyzycki. 2nd- Deb Fargo

**6:35 PM Field Day T-Shirts for Students/ End of year activities:** Mr. Bordeau spoke about the idea to purchase a t-shirt for each student for field day. In the past, colored shirts for each grade level but because this year is so different, he thought that buying each student a matching field day shirt would be something they really would enjoy. The t-shirts are white and green tie dye, with the Griswold paw in the middle. Mr. Bordeau expressed that he was hoping the PTO would split the cost with the school. Mr. B. also expressed that there would be no other additional expenses for field day this year. Students will be participating during their exploratory times on both days. Ashley M said that Chris Chastang has generously offered his time to DJ both days. Diane Langalis (P.E. teacher) and Mr. Bordeau said we would need the DJ for both days during lunch and recess from about 10:45- 2:00. Children would eat their lunch outside with their class; grilled food would be provided while they are listening to music. The total cost of the t-shirts would be \$4889.

6:42 PM Becky Whek asked if there were any more big costs that the PTO still has to pay out at the end of the year. Angela noted that Yearbook still has to be paid for, but it pays for itself; Anne (Yearbook Advisor) still needs to be paid her \$1500 stipend, and teacher reimbursements are trickling in. On a normal year, the PTO would have about \$17,000 left to roll over to the next year, but because fundraising fell very short this year due to Covid, there will be about \$13,000 left in the checkbook going forward to next year. Becky Whek asked Mr. B. if this year's T-shirts are a one and done deal, and he said yes. Next year he hopes to be going back to the grade level colored shirts.

6:47 PM A motion was made to split the cost of the t-shirts with GES (\$2,400). 1st- Becky Whek. 2nd- Deb Fargo

**6:51 PM Spring Book Fair Liz** R. spoke about this month's Book Fair. All items at the book fair will be eligible for a buy one get one free discount. There was a slight change of location; instead of having it in the Pre-K parking lot, it will now take place on the Playground Blacktop area. Due to Covid concerns, we are requesting sign ups ahead of time. The link to sign up for a spot can be found on the GES Scholastic Book Fair website or on the GES PTO Facebook page. There is still time to sign-up if you haven't done so already. So far, we have about 80 slots filled. Last week we were able to get the word out to families and staff. If you'd like to volunteer your time to help with the Book Fair we would greatly appreciate it. Ms. Beahan noted that students went home with bookmarks to take home that have the dates and times printed on them. Liz let her know that she can share the book fair website to families who have any questions about signing up to shop.

Michelle and Greta both introduced themselves and noted why they wanted to run for Treasurer. Greta: She has four boys in the Griswold School system and has been volunteering since her oldest, who is now in 10th grade, was in elementary school. She has been running Muffin morning and helping at the Book Fair for years. She is running for Treasurer because she wants to help out.

Michelle Flynn: She is new to Griswold and previously held a Board position at the last PTO. Her daughter is in third grade. She wants to be involved in any way she can.

**7:00 PM** By-law voting rules were stated. The ballot was then shared to members that were present at the meeting. **7:01 PM** Election results were read by Angela: Ashley McKinney, Co-Chair; Lindsay Gladue, Co-Chair; Greta Silva Treasurer; and Liz Rhoads; Secretary.

Michelle Flynn said even though she didn't win she would still help with events after school. She previously held a Board position at another elementary school before recently moving to Griswold. She also said she has a lot of experience with fundraising and running the Book Fair.
