PRESCHOOL NEWS

In the last few months, our units of study have focused on an Author Study of Jan Brett, Letters and Numbers Around Us, and Winter. This month we have learned about animals that hibernate in the winter. We are all awaiting spring when our animals wake up! We have focused our math instruction on counting to 10 and spatial awareness. In March we will focus our assessments on phonological awareness as this is an important pre-literacy skill for children. During this time, we will read books by Dr. Seuss and Nursery Rhymes. Our January

parent-teacher conferences went very well. This was an opportunity for teachers to talk to families about their child's progression and areas for further growth. Families were also asked to complete a NAEYC family evaluation that gives our program information about our strengths and areas for improvement. We would like to thank our families for completing these evaluations in order for us to improve our program. As we begin to plan for incoming preschool students for the next school year, information regarding screening will be coming out to the community in the next month. We would also like to thank our families for their continued support and flexibility as we work through times when our students are learning remotely. KINDERGARTEN NEWS

Everyone is adjusting to coming back after break and remote days! We have missed seeing all of our kiddos and hope we can get back into our routines! We have begun our big non-fiction animal unit and have started with learning about penguins and polar bears. These animals would sure love all the snow we are having! See if your kindergartener can give you a fact about penguins or polar bears. In literacy, we are beginning to read simple words and are learning what it means to "tap" a word out. We are also trying to write as much as possible. We are making lists, writing sentences, labeling pictures and working so hard. In math, we have been learning all about addition and subtraction. We are using counters, our fingers, and tens frame to help us solve these problems.

Please remember to send in coats, hats and gloves for outside recess. Please label all clothing and personal items. We go outside on most days. We also ask you to help your child practice zipping and buttoning.

1st Grade

FIRST GRADE NEWS

In spite of the cold, snowy weather, the first grade classes are "heating up" by continuing to develop new skills, abilities, and knowledge in all areas. In our literacy curriculum, we are learning about nonfiction. In this unit, our areas of focus are: What is nonfiction? How do we read a nonfiction text? What are the differences between fiction and non-fiction texts? What are the different text features in nonfiction and how can we use them to understand what we read? In every unit, we focus on comprehension skills that help develop a deeper understanding of the variety of stories we read. We will apply our new learning about nonfiction to our writing. Students are excited to choose an Arctic animal they would like to learn more about. They will be using non-fiction texts and Pebblego.com (online resource) to gather their information. First graders will be writing an informational piece. We are continuing to move forward in our Fundations program (phonics). We are learning about blends, inflected endings (ed, ing, es, er, est), and r controlled vowels (or, ir, er, ur, ar). We are also learning new trick words every week. Thank you for practicing those tricky words at home!

In math, we are working on adding and subtracting to 20. Within the unit, we are working on a variety of math skills that include making a ten to add or subtract, counting on or back, fact families, double facts, while also being exposed to tools and manipulatives to further support understanding. To ensure that each child develops a firm foundation in these complex math skills, we are providing many concrete, hands-on activities.

As a reminder, please make sure your child comes to school in layers. The weather is constantly changing and students need to be dressed appropriately in hats, gloves, and jackets to go out for recess.

SECOND GRADE NEWS

Our second graders have been working hard this year! Thank you families for all of your support during the transitions and changes that come with our hybrid learning model. We appreciate you! Our students have done a great job persevering and adapting to the changes this school year. We have focused on social and emotional wellbeing and connectedness during our morning meeting activities to foster a welcoming and supportive environment for our students. In math we have been learning strategies for addition and subtraction to 100, learning about place value, and continue to practice solving word problems. We are finishing up our folktale unit in reading. Students have done a lot of work with understanding character, point of view, comparing and contrasting similar stories, and retelling familiar stories. We are looking forward to meeting with families during parent conferences in March!



THIRD GRADE NEWS

Our third graders have been working hard! They have been working on a nonfiction unit where we explore text features and how to understand the way nonfiction is organized. We have been focusing on cause and effect as well. Students have been working on a small research project exploring a topic of their choice by finding books and taking notes. We have been learning how to use that information to write a report and how it is different from narrative writing.

In math, we are just finishing up addition and subtraction with three digit numbers, rounding and place value. We have recently started area and will be moving on to fractions after that. The most important thing is to keep them engaged and learning in spite of the pandemic. Keep practicing their math facts! We are looking forward to meeting you again during conferences to talk about your child's progress.



FOURTH GRADE NEWS

Grade 4 is finishing up our NWEA MAP Winter testing for both Reading and Math. Results will be shared with parents as the classes finish up testing. As a grade level, we are working hard on our nonfiction text units in both reading and writing, and we are looking forward to an exciting exploration into Podcasts. Students will be researching what they are, and then choosing topics to create student made podcasts! Stay tuned for more on this! In math, classes are learning how to multiply and divide larger numbers, and will move in fractions soon. A reminder to families that with the cold weather, wearing suitable cold weather gear is important for your child each day as we go outside daily for recess. A BIG THANK YOU to

families for your continued help with the education of your child at home. The time that you put in to help your child succeed does not go unnoticed! We appreciate that you are helping to make sure your child has a quiet place to participate in Meets, complete all their work on a daily basis, and put forth their best effort in their assigned activities. All classes are continuing to meet on Wednesdays, and to do assignments that are released in Seesaw or Google classroom.


