Reading Workshop

One focus of our nonfiction unit "Reading the Weather, Reading the World" this week is learning to recognize different text structures authors use to organize information in non-fiction texts (cause & effect, chronological order, compare/contrast, etc.). A 2nd focus is on determining the main idea and supporting details in a nonfiction text. Students will learn to summarize nonfiction texts and to include both the main and idea and supporting details in their written summaries.

Math

Students will be given an Area and Perimeter quiz on Tuesday, November 15th. The students have a review sheet in their binder.

We will begin our unit on division on Wednesday. Students will learn how to divide whole numbers, including division with remainders. Students will look at the relationship between multiplication and division, and learn strategies for solving multi-digit numbers by a 1 digit.

The graded DOM quiz will come home on Tuesday. Please review any missed problems with your child. Continue to study those multiplication facts.
