

We will be learning about the settlement of the Alabama territory following the Creek War. ALs rich soil, good climate, and navigable rivers drew many types of people to settle here. Students will learn about the lives of these early settlers, including squatters and speculators, yeoman farmers, planters, and slaves. The chapter concludes with a look at Eli Whitney's invention, the cotton gin, in making AL the "cotton kingdom."
